

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Clerk's office, Monday December 14th, 1925 at 2-00 P.M.

On motion duly made seconded and carried Justice George E. Penny was duly elected chairman of the meeting.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the minutes of the meeting of November 25th were read and duly adopted.


The Town Clerk presented a petition signed by a majority of the resident tax payers of the district there in described, for the establishment of a lighting district located partly within the Town of Riverhead and partly within the Town of Brookhaven at Wading River.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that upon the filing of a certified copy of the petition for the establishment of a lighting district at Wading River in the Towns of Riverhead and Brookhaven with the Town Clerk of Brookhaven by the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead that this board meet in joint session with the Town Board of the Town of Brookhaven, at such time and place as the Supervisor of the Town of Brookhaven may designate, for the purpose of establishing a lighting district in said towns bounded and described as follows, and to contract for street lighting therein, to wit:-

Beginning at the mouth of Wading River Creek on Long Island Sound and running thence easterly along the shore of Long Island Sound to Hulse's Landing Road; thence southerly and easterly along Hulse's Landing Road to the Port-Jefferson Riverhead State Highway; thence westerly along the State Highway to the Town Line between the towns of Riverhead and Brookhaven; thence still westerly along the State Highway to the Randall Road; thence northerly along the Randall Road to the North Country Road; thence northerly along the westerly line of the land of Lucy Howell adjoining the land of Belford and Terrill, to the Mill Pond; thence northwesterly across the Mill Pond to the head of Mill Creek and the line dividing the towns of Riverhead and Brookhaven; thence northerly along Mill Creek to the Wading River Creek; thence westerly and northerly along Wading River Creek to the Long Island Sound and the point or place of beginning.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that the Superintendent of Highways be authorized to employ counsel in the matter of compelling the Westchester Construction Company to return sand taken without permission from the side of the road at Deep Creek.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the board adjourned to meet at the town Clerk's office Wednesday December 30th, 1925 at 2-00 P.M.
