

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Clerk's office Thursday June 26th 1924 at 7-30 P.M.

Minutes of previous meeting read and on motion adopted.

Justice Penny, the committee appointed to purchase the flash signal to be placed at East Lane and Main Road at Jamesport, reported that he had purchased, from the Inter-flash Signal Corporation, a suitable street flash signal for the sum of \$ 275.00. On motion duly made seconded and carried the action of the committee was duly confirmed.

Messrs Harry Hooper of Brightwaters and Hermon Swezey of Babylon presented an application for a motor bus line franchise upon Griffin Avenue between the Long Island Rail road and Main Street and on Main Street between Griffin Ave and the easterly boundary line of the town, which application was duly filed with the Town Clerk on this day.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that this board hold a public hearing upon said application at the office of the Town Clerk Riverhead, N.Y. on the 18th day of July 1924 at 7-30 P.M. and that public notice of such hearing be given by this board by publication thereof in the Riverhead News and County Review in each of the two weeks preceding such hearing.


On motion duly made seconded and carried the Supervisor and Town Clerk were authorized and directed to borrow the sum of \$ 1300.00, to pay audited bills of June 24th, 1924.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that the rate of compensation for special constables for the enforcement of traffic regulations be fixed from this date at the rate of \$.625 per hour for services performed in accordance with instructions issued from time to time by this board or the Supervisor as to the number of hours in any one day that such services shall be performed.

On motion duly made seconded and carried Justice Penny and Supervisor were appointed a committee to consult with the various officials in charge of public buildings

for the purpose of establishing polling places in public buildings throughout the town where the same might legally and conveniently be done.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the board adjourned to meet at the town clerk's office on July 18th 1934 at 7-30 P.M.
