

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, held at the Town Clerk's office in said town on the 15th day of September, 1924, at two o'clock in the afternoon Daylight Saving Time.

The minutes of the regular meeting of August 26th, 1924, were read and on motion approved.

The minutes of the special meeting of September 2, 1924, were read and on motion approved.

The supervisor thereupon opened the proposals received up to the time of the opening of the meeting for the sale of town bonds in the sum of \$57,900.00 to pay the share of the town of the cost of construction and improvement of the Riverhead-Mattituck, Parts 1 & 3, County Federal Aid Highway, No. 8181, in the presence of all the members of the board and representatives of various bidders.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the foregoing bids were received and placed on file.

On motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried it was

RESOLVED that the bid of the Suffolk County Trust Company of Riverhead, N. Y., of 102.08 be and the same is hereby declared to be the highest bid, and be it further RESOLVED that the said bid of the Suffolk County Trust Company of Riverhead, N. Y., of 102.08 be and the same hereby is accepted, and the entire issue of Town Highway

Bonds, second series of 1924, in the amount of \$57,900.00 be and the same hereby is awarded to said Suffolk County Trust Company, and be it further

RESOLVED that the supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to proceed with the preparation, execution and delivery of said bonds in accordance with law, and with the performance of all acts and conditions required therein, and to deliver said bonds to said purchaser upon receipt of the full amount due at the time of such delivery pursuant said bid and proceedings heretofore had herein.

The Town Clerk read a communication received from Mr. Nathan Goldstein relative to parking signs in front of his premises on Main Street. On motion duly made seconded and carried the same was received and referred to the committee on parking regulations for report at the next meeting of the board.

The Town Clerk read a petition from owners of property on Fishel Avenue requesting the installation of additional street lights on said avenue for a space of 700 feet north of the last pole as now located on said avenue. On motion duly made, seconded and carried the said petition was received and placed on file and the prayer thereof granted and necessary street lights ordered placed pursuant thereto.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the supervisor was authorized to provide for the appointment of necessary additional special constables for the week of the Suffolk County Fair.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the committee to find location for town dumping ground for the disposal of rubbish was continued with a request that they endeavor to locate the same upon the Fanning Estate in the westerly part of the town, as recommended by the committee.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the petitions for the extension of Lighting District No. 1 were granted and the Lighting Committee was directed to prepare a proper resolution for such extension defining the district as proposed to be extended.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the board adjourned to meet at the Town Clerk's office on September 30, 1924, at four o'clock in the afternoon.
