

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Clerk's office May 16th, 1923 at 7-30 P.M. Daylight Saving Time.

Minutes of previous meeting read and on motion adopted.

Town Clerk read a communication received from L.V. Morris Chief Engineer of the L.I.R.R. relative to the widening of the bridge at Jamesport. Same was placed on file.

Town Clerk read a communication from the Women's Club stating that said Club was in favor of the Annexation of Riverside to the Town of Riverhead. Same was placed on file and Town Clerk was instructed to acknowledge receipt of same.

On motion made seconded and carried the following resolution was adopted.

"That it shall be unlawful to take from the waters of any creek in the Town of Riverhead being the arm of the Long Island Sound, more than one peck of clams to a single tide between May 1st. and Sept 1st. and not more than one bushel of clams from Sept 1st. to May 1st. per person." This law to take effect immediately and the same to be presented to Counsel and if approved by him to be published for a period of four weeks in the local papers of the Town.

Mr. William L. McDermott presented a petition signed by the resident owners on River Street and requested that the name of said street be changed to McDermott Avenue.

On motion made seconded and carried the name of River Street was changed to McDermott Avenue.

On motion made seconded and carried the following increase for Teams, Foreman, Laborers and man and horse was adopted, Same to take effect immediately.

Teams-----	90	cents	per	hour.
Foreman-----	45	"	"	"
Laborers-----	40	"	"	"
Man and Horse-----	60	"	"	"

It was decided to hold the next meeting on Thursday May 31st. at 7-30 P.M.
