

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Clerk's office Thursday, May 31 at 7-30 P.M.

Minutes of previous meeting read and on motion adopted. Sup't of Highways George H.Taft was instructed to have a sufficient number of signs made to read as follows: SLOW DOWN AND SAVE A FINE, said signs to be placed in the highway at the different entrances to the village and on some of the other streets in the town.

Mr.Harrison Corwin one of the Water Commissioners and Mr.Anthony Osip and Mr.Anthony Schaefer two taxpayers of the town appeared before the Board and the matter of enlarging the present Water District was thouroughly discussed and also the extending of hydrants on Osborne Ave.

Supervisor Dennis G.Homan appointed Justice Robert Burnside and Town Clerk Frank Sollar a committee to see what should be done in regards to the enlarging of the present Water District.

Mr.Anthony Schaefer stated that persons were dumping rubbish in the highway on Osborne Ave and that something should be done to stop this nuisance.

On motion made seconded and carried that it shall be unlawful for any person to dump any rubbish on the highways or on any property in the town without the consent of the owner. Any person violating this law will be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Town Clerk was instructed to have a sufficient number of placards printed of the above ordinance and post same in the most conspicuous places of the Town.

Town Clerk was instructed to write to the different persons owning buildings on Peconic Ave. and which are in the highway, stating that to our knowledge nothing has been done to have such parts of their buildings removed.

Suparvisor Dennis G.Homan and Town Clerk Frank Sollar were authorized to borrow the sum of \$ 1400. to pay audited bills as of May 29th, 1923.
