On motion made seconded and carried the above request was granted.

On motion made seconded and carried Supervisor Dennis G. Homan and Town Clerk Frank Sollar were authorized to borrow the sum of EIGHTEEN HUNDRED DOLLARS, (\$ 1800.00) to pay audited bills as of May 29th. 1922.

On motion made seconded and carried the resignation of Justice William F. Flanagan was accepted and filed.

On motion made seconded and carried that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead thank Mr. William F. Flanagan for his long and faithful services performed by him as a member of the Town Board and also as a Justice of the Peace. and Town Clerk was instructed to send Mr. Flanagan a copy of the above resolution.

On motion made seconded and carried Justice William L. Miller was appointed to serve on the committee to see about more Highways to the water in the Town of Riverhead. Said appointment being necessary to take the place of Justice William F. Flanagan, resigned.

There being no further business meeting adjourned.
