

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Clerk's Office, Friday November 19th, 1920 at 7:30 P.M.

Minutes of previous meeting read and on motion adopted.

On motion made seconded and carried The Receiver of Taxes of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York shall receive for year 1920 from the Town of Riverhead One Percent of the amount of the Warrant of the Town of Riverhead (Warrant \$179,291.06 amount to the Receiver of Taxes \$1792.91) according to Section 19, Chapter 311 of the Laws of 1920. And the Town Board authorizes the appointment of a clerk by the Receiver of Taxes for six weeks at the rate of \$25.00 per week. And also the Supervisor is authorized to arrange with the Receiver of Taxes the place and times of collection of Taxes.

On motion, made, seconded and carried Supervisor B. Frank Howell and Town Clerk Joseph W. Kratoville were authorized to borrow the sum of One Thousand (\$1000.00) Dollars from the Suffolk County National Bank, Riverhead, N.Y. and place same to the credit of the Highway account of the Town of Riverhead, N.Y.

The following letter was received by the Clerk of the Town Board and on motion made seconded and carried the Clerk was instructed to write to Mr. Norman L. Corwin accepting the terms of his letter.

Gentlemen:-

As chairman of Trustees of Roanoke Lodge #462, L. O. O. F. it is my duty to inform you that at a

regular meeting of the above order, held Oct. 28th, 1920, it was regularly moved and carried that the yearly rent of the Town Hall second floor of the Odd Fellows Building, be increased from \$150. to \$200. per annum, beginning Oct. 15, 1920.

I trust that your Board Members can readily understand the reasons for this advance, such as taxes now imposed, increased cost of maintenance of building, and the like, all of which, we think, warrants the above increase.



WHEREAS J. P. Morgan & Co., New York City has presented to the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead five bonds of the Riverhead Water District, which mature on December 1st, 1920 and demand payment thereof according to their terms and the amount due thereon being the sum of Five Thousand (\$5000.00) Dollars and interest, and whereas the amount of such principal to wit: Five Thousand (\$5000.00) Dollars has been inserted in the Tax Levy of said Town for the year 1920, therefore be it resolved that this Board in anticipation of the Taxes for the current fiscal year borrow upon the faith and credit of the Town the sum of Five Thousand (\$5000.00) Dollars for the purpose of paying the principal of said bonds so due as aforesaid by issuing a temporary certificate of indebtedness in said amount payable on the 1st day of February 1921 at a rate of interest not to exceed 5% per annum signed by the Supervisor and Town Clerk and that the proceeds thereof be placed to the credit of the Supervisor and by him paid to the holder of said bonds upon the surrender and cancellation thereof.

There being no further business meeting adjourned.
