

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Clerk's Office, Friday May 24th, 1918 at 8:00 P.M.

Minutes of previous meeting read and on motion adopted.

On motion seconded and carried Justice Wm. F. Flanagan was appointed a committee to formulate and present to this Board a plan for division of Election Districts of this Town in compliance with Sec. 296 "B" of the Election Law.

Inasmuch as Sec. 98 of the Town Law confers authority on the Town Board to fix the compensation of all Forest Rangers, and Assistants and provides that all expenses of fighting Forest Fires incurred under provisions of such section shall be a charge upon and paid by the town, it was on Motion seconded and carried, ordered that in the future all persons fighting Forest Fires receive a compensation of 30¢ per hour and 20¢ per mile for Auto Hire.

On Motion seconded and carried the following ordinance was adopted and ordered published four times in the local papers, and the Acting Town Clerk was ordered to have necessary Card Board copies printed and distributed about the Town.

#### TRAFFIC ORDINANCE.


Notice is hereby given that at a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk and State of New York held on May 24th, 1918. The following ordinance was enacted.

"That Automobiles and other Vehicles of all and every description are prohibited from parking in front of any Alley, Lane, Passageway, or entrance to any residential or business property in the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk and State of New York."

Any person violating the above Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable in a case of conviction by a fine not exceeding \$25.00.

On Motion seconded and carried it was ordered that a letter be sent to the L.I.R.R. requesting, the Co. not to discontinue the West bound Train leaving Riverhead daily @ 6:21 A.M. Such action being taken because of the fact that such train serves several hundred commuters residing in this vicinity, and if discontinued would be a hardship for such persons.

There being no further business meeting adjourned.
