

MINUTES of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk and State of New York, organized as a Board of Canvassers and held on the 9th day of November, 1916, in the Town Clerk's Office in Riverhead, New York at 9:00 A.M.

On motion William L. Miller was appointed chairman of the meeting and J. Fred Dugan was appointed Secretary.

B. FRANK HOWELL Jr., by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Supervisor in and for the said Town.

JOSEPH W. KRATOVILLE, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Town Clerk in and for the said Town.

WILLIAM F. FLANAGAN, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Justice of the Peace in and for the said Town for the term of two years.

GEORGE W. HILDRETH and WALTER S. DOWNS, by the greatest number of votes were duly elected Justices of the Peace for the term of four years in and for said Town.

ALBERT W. CONKLIN, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Collector in and for said Town.

ASA D. FORDHAM, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Assessor in and for said Town for the term of two years.

BENJAMIN P. YOUNG, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Assessor in and for the said Town for the term of *four* years.

SIDNEY W. REEVE, by the greatest number of votes was duly elected Overseer of the Poor in and for said Town.

WM. H. DAYTON, V. ARTHUR NUGENT, ARTHUR J. HOWELL, ANDREW PRUDENT, FRANK FILMANSKI, by the greatest number of votes were severally duly elected constables in and for said Town.

ROBERT P. GRIFFING, VERNON H. DOWNS, ORVIS H. LUCE, by the greatest number of votes were severally duly elected Town Auditors in and for said Town.

Proposition #1: Shall there be inserted in the Tax Levy for the years 1917 and 1918, the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars for the Contingent Fund?

Proposition #2: Shall there be inserted in the Tax Levy for the years 1917 and 1918, the sum of Fifteen Hundred (\$1500.00) Dollars for the Board of Health Fund?

Proposition #3: Shall there be inserted in the Tax Levy for the years 1917 and 1918, the sum of Fifteen Hundred (\$1500.00) Dollars for the Overseer of the Poor Fund?

Proposition #4: Shall there be inserted in the Tax Levy for the years 1917 and 1918, the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars for the proper observance of Memorial Day, said sum to be payable to the Commander of Henry A. Barnum Post, G.A.R., of Riverhead, N.Y.?

Proposition #5: Shall there be inserted in the Tax Levy for the years 1917 and 1918, the sum of Ninety-Six (\$96.00) Dollars for the payment of the rent of the post rooms of Henry A. Barnum Post, G.A.R., Riverhead, N.Y.?

Proposition #6: Shall there be inserted in the Tax Levy for the years 1917 and 1918, the sum of One hundred Fifty (\$150.00) Dollars for the purpose of contributing said amount to St. Peter's Hospital of Brooklyn in consideration of treatment of such poor patients that may be sent to such institution from the Town of Riverhead?

Do hereby certify, determine and declare that the total number of votes given for proposition #1 was 490 and the total number of votes against proposition #1 was 415.

Do hereby certify, determine and declare that the total number votes given for proposition #2 was 498 and the total number of votes against proposition #2 was 398.

Do hereby certify, determine and declare that the total number of votes given for proposition #3 was 541 and the total number of votes against proposition #3 was 373.

Do hereby certify, determine and declare that the total number of votes given for proposition #4 was 589 and the total number of votes against proposition #4 was 358.

Do hereby certify, determine and declare that the total number of votes for proposition #5 was 564 and the total number of votes against proposition #5 was 364.

Do hereby certify, determine and declare that the total number of votes for proposition #6 was 596 and the total number of votes against proposition #6 was 323.

This Board having canvassed and estimated the votes relative to the following question submitted (local option) given in the several election districts in the said Town at a Town Meeting held at the time of the General Election on Tuesday, November 7th, 1916.

Question 1: Selling liquor to be drunk on the premises where sold. Shall any person be authorized to traffic in liquors under the provisions of subdivision two of section eight of the liquor tax law, namely, by selling liquor to be drunk on the premises where sold, in the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York?

Question 2: Selling liquor not to be drunk on the premises where sold. Shall any person be authorized to traffic in liquors under the provisions of subdivision two of section eight of the liquor law, namely, by selling liquor not to be drunk on the premises where sold, in the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York?

Question 3: Selling liquor as a pharmacist on a physician's prescription. Shall any person be authorized to traffic in liquors under the provisions of subdivision three of section eight of the liquor tax law namely, by selling liquor as a pharmacist on a physician's prescription in the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York?

Question 4: Selling liquor by hotel keepers only. Shall any person be authorized to traffic in liquors under subdivision one of section eight of the liquor tax law, but only in connection with the business of keeping a hotel, in the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, if the majority of the votes cast on the first question submitted are in the negative?

Do hereby certify, determine and declare that the total number of votes given for Question 1 was 606 and the total number of votes against question 1 was 502.

Do hereby certify, determine and declare that the total number of votes given for question 2 was 592 and the total number of votes against question 2 was 487.

Do hereby certify, determine and declare that the total number of votes given for question 3 was 567 and the total number of votes against question 3 was 429.

Do hereby certify, determine and declare that  
the total number of votes given for question 4 was 563  
and the total number of votes against question 4 was 415.
