

MINUTES of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Clerk's Office, Friday August 1st, 1913 at 1:00 P.M.

On motion, August 18th, 1913 at 1:00 P.M. was the date and time fixed for a public meeting to be held in the Town Hall relative to applications for Gas Franchises in the Town of Riverhead.

On motion the Clerk was instructed to publish notice of such meeting in the local papers.

On motion it was ordered that a meeting of the Town Board be held on the last Monday of every month at 2:00 P.M.

On motion it was ordered that the Town Board's action authorizing supervisor, Dwight T. Corwin to purchase a three rod strip of land at Baiting Hollow of John W. Fanning be rescinded inasmuch as Mr. Fanning had subsequently offered to sell to the Town a much larger parcel for the sum of \$100.00, which latter parcel in the opinion of the

Board would be much more desirable for highway purposes.

On motion the Supervisor was authorized to purchase in the name of the Town of Riverhead from John W. Fanning for the sum of \$100.00, all that parcel of land described as follows: Situate at Baiting Hollow, Town of Riverhead County of Suffolk and State of New York:

"Commencing at a Marble monument at the intersection of the East line of Osborn Avenue with the south line of the Main North Road and running thence south 66° 30' east 100.00 feet along the south line of said Main North Road thence south 44° 15' west 70.85 feet to a point on the east line of Osborn Avenue; thence north 25° 00' west 100.00 feet along the east line of said Osborn Avenue to the point or place of beginning. Containing 0.129 acres"

On motion it was ordered that the Town pay all the expenses of Searching Title; preparing and recording papers and surveying the property, incurred in acquiring above property of John W. Fanning.

There being no further business, meeting adjourned.
