

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Clerk's Office, Friday May 17, 1912 at 4:00 P. M.

On Motion it was resolved that the Assessors for the Town of Riverhead be allowed (\$150) or as much thereof as may be necessary for Horse Hire in connection with their Duties as assessors of the Town of Riverhead.

The matter of the side tract extension of the Long Island Railroad, which lies in the bed of Railroad Ave., between Griffing and Roanoke Aves. in the Village of Riverhead was thoroughly discussed by the members of the Board and ON MOTION the Town Superintendant of Highways Wm. A. Brown was instructed to have prepared and sent to said Long Island Railroad Co. the usual notice to vacate.

On Motion the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, the Office of the Supervisor of the Town of Riverhead, New York, requires a large amount of Clerical work entries and records of several thousand items each year now be it

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor of the Town of Riverhead be and he is hereby authorized to expend the sum of Fifty Dollars or as much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose of procuring whatever clerical work is necessary in connection with his administration of such Office.

On Motion the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, the clerical work required of the Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Riverhead, New York is of Importance and requires a considerable amount of time and labor, now be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Superintendent of Highways be and he is hereby authorized to expend the sum of Fifty Dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose of procuring whatever clerical work is necessary in connection with his administration of such Office.

On Motion the following Resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, the landing place, commonly known as the Town Dock, in the Village of Riverhead, New York, is habitually used by persons as a permanent wharfing place for vessels to the

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detriment of the public welfare and use of said Dock, be it  
RESOLVED, that the Town Superintendent of Highways, be and  
he is hereby authorized and instructed to have prepared  
two signs to join each other at right angles to be placed  
on the Southeast corner of said Dock, facing Southerly  
and Easterly.


NOTICE
