



Minutes of a Special Meeting of the Riverhead Town Board held by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead at Town Hall, 200 Howell Avenue, Riverhead, New York, on Thursday, July 22, 2004, at 4:00 p.m.

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Supervisor Cardinale called the meeting to order at 4:22 p.m.

Supervisor Cardinale: "Ready? Okay. We're opening the Town Board- Special Town Board meeting of July 22nd. It's 4:22.

We have a waiver of notice of notice of consent of special meeting of the Town Board signed by all the members. We have notified the press who hang around here all the time, and we're going to pick up the tabled Resolution #646.

Barbara, do you have- before we pick up the tabled resolution, do you have an amendment that you want to make before we offer it and second it?"

Councilwoman Blass: "Yes. There are three amendments. The first is on the first page the location (inaudible) beginning on the south side of the Second Street intersection southerly to the northerly side of Front Street at the Front Street intersection with Center Street we are (inaudible) the words to an imaginary line 100 feet from and parallel."

Supervisor Cardinale: "So to the northerly side of Front Street- "

Councilwoman Blass: "We're deleting the words-- "

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay."

Councilwoman Blass: "-- to an imaginary line- "

Supervisor Cardinale: "-- okay, right. Right."

Councilwoman Blass: "On the second page, Willow Street, which appears right above seasonal parking (inaudible) that designation, the word Front Street in the location should be Center Street. (Inaudible)."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay, got it, I think."

Councilwoman Blass: "Back to Center Street, under seasonal parking, the location, again, we are deleting the words an imaginary line 100 feet from and parallel to."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay, with those amendments, if you offer- would you offer this resolution for consideration, Barbara?"

Councilwoman Blass: (Inaudible)

Supervisor Cardinale: "Oh, yeah. You do. You're right. (Inaudible)."

Councilwoman Blass: "646 off the table."

Councilman Densieski: "Second the motion."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Motion made, seconded to take off the table. Vote, please."

The Vote: "Bartunek."

Councilman Bartunek: "Yes. Based upon the public hearing-- "

Councilman Densieski: "Just to take it off the table."

Councilman Bartunek: "Oh, it is just to take it off the table. Yes."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay. Yes, to take it off the table."

The Vote (Cont'd.): "Sanders, yes; Blass, yes; Densieski, yes; Cardinale."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Yes. To take it off the table."

Barbara Grattan: "5 yes to take it off the table."

Councilwoman Blass: "I make a motion to approve Resolution 646."

Councilman Densieski: "Second the motion."

The Vote: "Bartunek, yes; Sanders, yes; Blass, yes; Densieski."

Councilman Densieski: "I'm not really for no parking signs all over the place. People have cars. There's very small lots in that community. People want to have company. They want to have family members have cars and I'm very curious about the motivation of some of these no parking stalls. So I'm going to vote no."

The Vote (Cont'd.): "Cardinale."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay. Before voting, I just wanted to-- I now get it because it's very clear with this map what we're doing. And, Barbara, could you just place on the record what the public purpose, if asked, is to put-- to have as you've got here seasonal parking permitted on certain side of the street and parking prohibited on the other side. What is the purpose you're trying to accomplish?"

Councilwoman Blass: "The concept is for all of those streets south of Second Street in the S. Jamesport area, to ensure that the lanes which are very narrow, the road is very narrow, remain passable. Especially during the summer season it gets very congested down there."

The public purpose is by prohibiting parking on one side, the streets are safer and accessible for fire vehicles and everyone else."

Supervisor Cardinale: "That's what I thought."

Councilwoman Blass: "It's a question of just ensuring that they do not become narrow as to restrict passage for anyone, including emergency responders."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Good. All right. That's what I understood although I picked this up late. I know you've been working on it for a while. I believe that's a valid and important purpose. I vote yes."

Barbara Grattan: "Okay. That resolution is adopted."

Now we go on to Resolution #677."

Resolution #677

Councilwoman Sanders: "Adopts a local law creating Chapter 29 entitled Outdoor Dining of the Riverhead town code. So moved."

Councilman Densieski: "Second the motion."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Moved and seconded. Vote, please."

The Vote: "Bartunek, yes; Sanders."

Councilwoman Sanders: "I just want to say I am sorry it took so long. This is something that should have been done I know years ago, but it just seemed that the time was right with the effort that's being made to revitalize downtown, that this is something that we would want to welcome downtown. So, with that, I vote yes."

The Vote (Cont'd.): "Blass."

Councilwoma Blass: "Yes. And I'd like to commend Councilwoman Sanders for her work on this."

The Vote (Cont'd.): "Densieski, yes; Cardinale,."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Yeah. I think this is a great idea. Thank you for putting it together. And I vote yes."

Councilwoman Sanders: "Thank you for everybody's help."

Supervisor Cardinale: "Okay. We have concluded the Town Board meeting, just those two that we wanted to get passed and mentioned on Tuesday.

We're going into executive session and we thank everybody for attending and look forward to seeing you at next Thursday."

(Inaudible comment - from the audience)

Supervisor Cardinale: "Look forward to seeing you seating al fresco on Main Street in the next hour or so."

Councilman Densieski: "Expect a table to be out in a half hour."

Meeting adjourned: 4:29 p.m.
