**AUTHORIZES CDA TO ENTER INTO LICENSE AGREEMENT WITH
METRO TERMINALS**

Councilman Wooten offered the following resolution,

which was seconded by Councilman Gabrielsen

RESOLVED, that the Chairman be and hereby is authorized to enter into the license agreement attached hereto on behalf of the Riverhead Community Development Agency (CDA) with Metro Terminals of Long Island, LLC (Metro) upon the following terms and conditions which shall be incorporated into a binding agreement as follows:

1. Metro shall cause the construction of an extension to the existing rail spur which currently ends at lot 32 North over said lot 32 thence along the easterly side of lot 33 continuing on to lot 28 as such lots are depicted on the "Map of Calverton Camelot" filed in the office of the Clerk of Suffolk County on March 9, 2007 as Map No. 11500. Upon completion, before use, such spur shall be dedicated to the CDA, at no cost and expense of the CDA, to be incorporated into the "Subject Track" to be operated by the CDA through agreement with the entity authorized to operate the freight rail operations of the LIRR track to which the Subject Track connects at Connecticut Avenue, Calverton, New York ("Freight Entity).
2. Metro shall grant the CDA and the CDA shall accept an easement over and through said lots 32 and 28 of Metro to permit the operation and maintenance of the rail spur as the same is provided in the Easement and Declaration of Railroad Easement recorded Liber D00012498 at page 663 with the Clerk of Suffolk County.
3. The Easement granted by the Riverhead Water District to the CDA shall have been executed and recorded as contemplated by such resolutions presented herewith.
4. Metro in conjunction with the construction of the rail spur required herein shall at its sole cost and expense relocate the facilities of the Riverhead Water District on Lot 33 aforesaid and abide by all conditions of the Easement from the District to the CDA, and
5. Use of the rail spur over lots 32, 33 and 28 shall recognize the need of Metro to off load rail cars at the facilities constructed by Metro at lot 32, and such unloading shall be given a priority by the CDA through its agreement with the Freight Entity. However, Metro rail cars shall not be stored on lot 33.

6. All conditions required by Suffolk County Department of Health Services relating to operation of Plant 12 of the Riverhead Water District shall be required by the CDA agreement with the Freight Entity.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairman be and hereby is authorized to execute any documents necessary regarding Easement described in 3. above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all Town Hall Departments may review and obtain a copy of this resolution from the electronic storage device and, if needed, a certified copy of same may be obtained from the Office of the Town Clerk.

10. GENERAL PROVISIONS

a. The Licensor hereby grants to the LICENSEE, its employees, agents, and contractors the right to use the premises or facilities described in Item 3, together with the necessary rights of ingress and egress.

b. This License shall be effective for the period stated in Item 2 and is revocable at any time without notice at the option and discretion of the Licensor or its duly authorized representative.

c. The use shall be limited to the purposes specified herein.

d. This License shall be neither assignable nor transferable by the LICENSEE.

e. If utilities and services are furnished the LICENSEE for its use of the premises, the LICENSEE shall reimburse the Licensor for the cost thereof as determined by the Licensor in accordance with applicable statutes and regulations.

f. The LICENSEE, at its own cost and expense, shall protect, maintain, and keep in good order, the premises or facilities licensed hereby. At the discretion of the Licensor this obligation shall include, but not be limited to, contribution toward the expense of long-term maintenance of the premises or facilities, the necessity for which accrued during the period of LICENSEE's use. The amount of expense to be borne by the LICENSEE shall be determined by prorating the total expense of the item of long-term maintenance on the basis of fractional use by the LICENSEE. This fractional part of the total expense shall be prorated further if the item of long-term maintenance did not accrue in its entirety during the LICENSEE's use. Upon a determination by the CDA that the necessity exists for an expenditure of funds for maintenance, protection, preservation or repair, the LICENSEE shall pay to the CDA its proportionate share, on demand.

g. No additions to, or alternations of, the premises or facilities shall be made without the prior consent of the CDA. With exception of the rail construction project shown on Attachment A, upon revocation or surrender of this License, to the extent directed by the CDA, the LICENSEE shall remove all alterations, additions, betterments and improvements made, or installed, and restore the premises or facilities to the same or as good condition as existed on the date of entry under this license, reasonable wear and tear excepted.

h. The LICENSEE shall be liable for any loss of or damage to, the premises or facilities incurred as a result of its use and shall make such restoration or repair, or monetary compensation as may be directed by the CDA. The LICENSEE's liability for loss or damage to the premises resulting from risks expressly required to be insured hereunder shall not exceed the amount of insurance so required. The LICENSEE shall not be liable for loss of or damage to, the premises arising from causes beyond the control of the LICENSEE and occasioned by a risk not in fact covered by insurance and not customarily covered by insurance in the locality in which the premises are situated. Nothing contained herein, however, shall relieve the LICENSEE of liability with respect to any loss or damage to the premises, not fully compensated for by insurance, which results from willful misconduct, lack of good faith, or failure to exercise due diligence, on the part of the LICENSEE. All insurance required of the LICENSEE on the premises shall be for the protection of the CDA and the LICENSEE against their respective risks and liabilities in connection with the premises. Each policy of insurance against loss or damage to CDA property shall name the LICENSEE and the Town of Riverhead Community Development Agency, as the insured and shall contain a loss payable clause reading substantially as follows:

"Loss, if any, under this policy shall be adjusted with (Name of LICENSEE) and the proceeds, at the direction of the CDA, shall be payable to (Name of LICENSEE), and proceeds not paid to (Name of LICENSEE) shall be payable to the "Town of Riverhead Community Development Agency."

In the event that any item or part of the premises or facilities shall require repair, rebuilding or replacement resulting from loss or damage, the risk of which is assumed under this paragraph h, the LICENSEE shall promptly give notice thereof to the CDA and, to the extent of its liability as provided in this paragraph, shall, upon demand, either compensate the CDA for such loss or damage, or rebuild, replace or repair the item or items of the

premises or facilities so lost or damaged, as the CDA may elect. If the cost of such repair, rebuilding, or replacement exceeds the liability of the LICENSEE for such loss or damage, the LICENSEE shall effect such repair, rebuilding or replacement if required so to do by the CDA, and such excess of cost shall be reimbursed to the LICENSEE by the CDA. In the event the LICENSEE shall have effected any repair, rebuilding or replacement which the LICENSEE is required to effect pursuant to this paragraph, the CDA shall direct payment to the LICENSEE of so much of the proceeds of any insurance carried by the LICENSEE and made available to the CDA on account of loss of or damage to any item or part of the premises or facilities as may be necessary to enable the LICENSEE to effect such repair, rebuilding or replacement. In the event the LICENSEE shall not have been required to effect such repair, rebuilding, or replacement, and the insurance proceeds allocable to the loss or damage which has created the need for such repair, rebuilding or replacement have been paid to the LICENSEE, the LICENSEE shall promptly refund to the CDA the amount of such proceeds.

i. The LICENSEE shall indemnify and save harmless the CDA, its officers, agents, servants and employees from all liability under the Federal Tort Claims Act (62 Stat. 869, 982; 28 U.S.C. Sec 2671, 2680) or otherwise, for death or injury to all persons, or loss or damage to the property of all persons resulting from the use of the premises by the LICENSEE, and shall furnish the insurance specified in Item 9. Each policy of insurance required in Item 9 covering bodily injuries and third party property damage shall contain an endorsement reading substantially as follows:

"The insurer waives any right to subrogation against the United States of America which might arise by reason of any payment made under this policy."

j. All insurance required by this License shall be in such form, for such periods of time, and with such insurers as the CDA may require or approve. A certificate of insurance or a certified copy of each policy of insurance taken out hereunder shall be deposited with the CDA's local representative prior to use of the premises and facilities. The LICENSEE agrees that not less than thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of any insurance required by this License, it will deliver to the CDA's local representative a certificate of insurance or a certified copy of each renewal policy to cover the same risks.

k. The LICENSEE warrants that it has not employed any person to solicit or secure this License upon any agreement of a commission, percentage, brokerage or contingent fee. Breach of this warranty shall give the CDA the right to annul this License or in its discretion to recover from the LICENSEE the amount of such commission, percentage, brokerage or contingent fee in addition to the consideration herein set forth. This warranty shall not apply to commissions payable by the LICENSEE upon contracts or sales secured or made through bona fide established commercial or selling agencies maintained by the LICENSEE for the purpose of securing business.

l. In connection with the performance of work under this License, the LICENSEE agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, or national origin. The aforesaid provision shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The LICENSEE agrees to post hereafter in conspicuous places available for employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the CDA setting forth the provisions of the nondiscrimination clause. The LICENSEE further agrees to insert the foregoing provision in all subcontracts hereunder, except subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.

m. All activities authorized hereunder shall be subject to such rules and regulations as regards supervision or otherwise, as may, from time to time, be prescribed by the local representative of the CDA as designed in Item 5a.

**ADDENDUM NUMBER 1 TO TOWN OF RIVERHEAD
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AGENCY
LICENSE FOR PLANT 12
GENERAL PROVISIONS**

10.n. INDEMNIFICATION: LICENSEE accepts responsibility for all liability related to, or arising under, LICENSEE's use of the property. Further, LICENSEE shall release and hold harmless the CDA, its officers, agents, and employees from all liability, suits, claims, actions, or demands in any way related to, or arising under, LICENSEE's use of the property. This includes, but is not limited to, all environmental suits, claims, and enforcement actions, arising during LICENSEE's construction on, or use of, the property, or after such construction, or use, has ended. Further, LICENSEE shall reimburse the CDA for all expenditures incurred if the CDA voluntarily chooses to undertake any remedial action to address contamination on the premises or facilities resulting from the acts or omissions of LICENSEE.

10.o. GRATUITIES: The CDA, by written notice to the LICENSEE, may terminate the rights of the LICENSEE under this License if it is found, after notice and hearing, that gratuities (in the form of entertainment, gifts, or otherwise) were offered or given by the LICENSEE, or any agent or representative of the LICENSEE, to any officer or employee of the CDA with a view toward securing a license or securing favorable treatment with respect to the awarding or amendment, or the making of any determination with respect to the performing of such license; provided, that the existence of the facts upon which the Secretary or his duly authorized representative makes such findings shall be in issue and may be reviewed in any competent court. In the event this License is so terminated, the CDA shall be entitled (1) to pursue the same remedies against the LICENSEE as it could pursue in the event of a breach of the contract by the LICENSEE; and (2) as a penalty in addition to damages in an amount (as determined by the Secretary or his duly authorized representative) which shall be not less than three nor more than ten times the cost incurred by the LICENSEE in providing such gratuities to any such officer or employee. The rights and remedies of the CDA provided in this clause shall not be exclusive and are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or under this License.

10.p. LICENSEE shall not unduly interfere or inhibit the CDA's mission at the former NWIRP Calverton, NY.

10.q. As consideration for this License, LICENSEE shall provide, or cause to be provided, protection and maintenance for the Licensed property. It is understood and agreed that LICENSEE shall, at its own expense, protect and maintain the Licensed Property. During the term of this License, CDA shall have no responsibility except as otherwise described herein, financial or otherwise, with respect to maintenance of the Licensed Property.

10.r. The CDA and Riverhead Water District shall be allowed access to the Licensed Property at all reasonable times through the term of this License.

10.s. Any cost, expense, or liability connected with or in any manner incident to the LICENSEE's performance of this License shall be assumed and discharged by the LICENSEE.

10.t. Insurance requirements shall be applied to all LICENSEE representatives performing work or service under the License.

10.u. Upon completion of the term of this License, LICENSEE guarantees that the Licensed Property will be free from Debris and any other undesirable materials and the LICENSEE shall restore the premises to the same or as good condition as existed prior to the initiation of this license with exception of the rail construction project shown on Attachment A.

10.v. The LICENSEE's rights under this license shall be subject to rules and regulations prescribed by the CDA to ensure that the exercise of these rights will not unduly interfere with CDA activities.

10.w. In accordance with 10 U.S.C. §2692, the LICENSEE may not allow the treatment, storage or disposal of any Toxic or Hazardous materials on the PREMISES.

10.x. The LICENSEE will reimburse the CDA for all expenditures incurred if the CDA undertakes any Remedial Action to address Contamination on the PREMISES resulting from the acts or omissions of the LICENSEE or its contractors.

10.y. During the term of this license, if the LICENSEE becomes aware that a Release of Toxic or Hazardous Materials has occurred due to acts or omissions of the GRANTEE, its agents, or contractors, whether or not such Release results in Contamination of the PREMISES, the GRANTEE will give verbal notice to the CDA within 24 hours of becoming aware of the Release, providing all relevant facts and circumstances. The CDA may direct the GRANTEE to make a detailed written report of these facts and circumstances within a time certain.

10.z. The LICENSEE will promptly take all actions, necessary to comply with Applicable Environmental Laws pertaining to a Release described in subparagraph 10.x, including but not limited to: (1) report the occurrence to appropriate Federal, State, or local regulatory authorities, if so directed by the CDA; (2) take timely and effective steps to minimize the Release and its impact on human health and the environment; and (3) take Remedial Action. The CDA may direct the GRANTEE to provide all information requested by the CDA regarding such actions within a time certain.

10.aa. During the term of this license, the LICENSEE will ensure that all activities conducted by the LICENSEE or its contractors on the PREMISES are carried out in compliance with Applicable Environmental Laws. The LICENSEE will provide oral notice to the CDA within 24 hours of receiving any complaint, order, directive, claim, citation, or notice by any CDA authority or any other person or entity with respect to a violation of Applicable Environmental Laws resulting from the activities of the LICENSEE or its contractors on the PREMISES. The LICENSEE will promptly take all actions, at its sole expense, as are necessary to comply with all Applicable Environmental Laws as directed by any Federal, State, or local regulatory authority of competent jurisdiction to achieve or regain compliance with Applicable Environmental Laws. The CDA may request a more detailed written description of the events or circumstances leading to this event within a time specified by the CDA. Without limitation of the foregoing, the CDA, in response to acts or omissions of the LICENSEE, its agents, or contractors may, in its discretion, take Remedial Action to remedy Contamination on the PREMISES or to achieve or regain compliance with Applicable Environmental Laws.

10.ab. The CDA may at any time inspect the PREMISES or cause the PREMISES to be inspected, to assess whether the operations of the GRANTEE, its agents, or contractors are in compliance with Applicable Environmental Laws. To assist in this evaluation, the GRANTEE, its agents, and contractors will provide to the CDA, or another entity, as the CDA may direct, for examination and copying, all relevant books, records, documents, and other material in their possession.

**ADDENDUM NUMBER 1 TO TOWN OF RIVERHEAD

GENERAL PROVISIONS**

10.ac. The CDA, with good cause, may from time-to-time require the GRANTEE to conduct tests and analyses to assess whether the PREMISES are in compliance with Applicable Environmental Laws, and based on the results thereof, to so certify to the CDA. Such tests and analyses shall be conducted in a manner satisfactory to the CDA by recognized professionals approved by the CDA. If the CDA and the GRANTEE cannot reach agreement as to what tests and analyses shall be conducted, by whom, and when, the CDA may perform such tests and analyses or cause such tests and analyses to be performed.

10.ad. For the purposes of this provision, the terms used above are defined as follows:

“Toxic or Hazardous Materials” means all manner of substances, pollutants, contaminants, and waste to which Applicable Environmental Laws pertain, expressly including petroleum, petroleum products, and materials defined in 48 C.F.R. § 252.223-7006 (a)(ii) and (iii).

“Contamination” means a level of Toxic or Hazardous Materials in the air, soil, or water (surface water or ground water) that exceeds levels allowed by Applicable Environmental Laws.

“Applicable Environmental Laws” means

REVOCABLE LICENSE AGREEMENT

This Revocable License Agreement ("hereinafter License"), made as of the _____ day of _____, 2011, by and between the Town of Riverhead, ("Licensor") with offices at 200 Howell Avenue, Riverhead, New York 11901, and _____ ("Licensee"), residing at _____, New York _____.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, _____ wishes to utilize Town of Riverhead property at Enterprise Park At Calverton ("EPCAL") more fully delineated on the attached map for the express and sole purpose of bow hunting for deer only; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Riverhead wishes to grant the Licensee a revocable, non-transferable license to utilize the EPCAL property more fully delineated on the attached map, for bow hunting for deer only;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual agreements herein contained, Licensor and Licensee, for themselves and their successors, hereby agree as follows:

1. **Licensing.** Upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, Licensor hereby licenses to Licensee the revocable, non-transferable right to use the Licensed Premises depicted on the map of EPCAL annexed hereto and made a part hereof solely for bowhunting for deer only.

2. **Term of the License.** The term of this License (the "term") shall commence on October 10, 2011, and shall end on November 27, 2011; hunting hours: sunrise to sunset.

3. **Licensee Representations.** Licensee represents that Licensee possesses a valid and current New York State Deer Hunting License and big game tag. Licensee further represents that Licensee attended and successfully completed a New York State approved 8 hour minimum bowhunter education course and possesses a valid and current bowhunter education certificate. Licensee further represents that Licensee is fully aware of and shall abide by all New York State laws, rules and regulations regarding deer hunting. Licensee further represents and agrees to abide by the directives of the EPCAL Hunting Committee, Town of Riverhead officials and employees, law enforcement personnel and all governmental agencies having jurisdiction of bowhunting activity. Licensee further acknowledges that a failure to abide by the terms and conditions contained herein shall be grounds for immediate revocation of this hunting license. Licensee further acknowledges that any misrepresentation shall be grounds for immediate revocation of this hunting license.

4. **Condition of the Licensed Premises.** Licensee is familiar with the Licensed Premises, has examined same, and, except as explicitly hereinafter provided, Licensee agrees to accept the licensed premises in its "as is" condition without reliance upon any representations or warranties of or made by Licensor.

5. **Indemnification.** Licensee agrees to indemnify and hold the Town of Riverhead and their respective officers, employees, agents, representatives and officials

harmless from any and all loss, including death or physical injury to persons, or liability associated with Licensee's use of the property and related activities described herein, including liability for damages to property which may arise from, or be attributable or incident to the use by Licensee excepting liability solely caused by the gross negligence of the Town or its employees, agents or representatives. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, Licensee agrees with respect to any suit or claim by the Town, whether under this indemnification provision or otherwise, Licensee, hereby expressly waives any defense which might preclude or limit either enforcement of this indemnification clause or any reasonable attorneys fees incurred by the Town of Riverhead securing compliance with the provision of this indemnification agreement.

Licensee shall also indemnify and hold the Licensor harmless from and against any and all claims, actions, liabilities, losses (including, without limitation, consequential and special damages), costs and expenses (including, without limitation, court costs and reasonable attorney fees and expenses, including appeals), arising from or in connection with the use of the licensed premises.

6. **Assignment.** Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the License, Licensee shall not assign this License, the use of the Licensed Premises, in whole or in part, or permit Licensee's interest to be vested in any other party other than Licensee by operation of law or otherwise without the express written consent of the Licensor.

7. **Notices.** Any notices to be given under this License shall be in writing and shall be sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested. If such notice is

directed to Licensor, it shall be addressed to the attention of the Riverhead Town Supervisor and the Office of the Riverhead Town Attorney at 200 Howell Avenue, Riverhead, New York. If such notice is directed to the Licensee, it shall be forwarded to the Licensee's address first above written.

8. **Miscellaneous**. Merger: All prior understandings and agreements between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof are merged within this agreement, which alone, fully and completely sets forth the understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. This license may not be changed or terminated orally, or in any manner, other than in writing signed by the party against whom enforcement is sought.



WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of §247 of the New York State General Municipal Law, fee simple owners of lands may elect to sell and the Town of Riverhead may elect to purchase lands for open space; and

WHEREAS, North Fork Preserve, Inc. and North Fork Preserve, Co. have expressed a desire to sell open space consisting of approximately 307 acres of land located on the north side of Sound Avenue, Riverhead, New York, described as SCTM #0600-7-3-41 and 0600-21-1-1.2 and commonly known as North Fork Preserve; and

WHEREAS, the County of Suffolk has determined that the Premises meet the criteria for acquisition under the Suffolk County Drinking Water Protection Program (effective December 1, 2007); and

WHEREAS, the Town, by Resolution adopted on December 21, 2010, approved a joint acquisition wherein the County of Suffolk and the Town of Riverhead agreed to share the cost of purchasing a portion of the property, approximately 90.43 acres of the 311.01 acres under the following terms and conditions: County of Suffolk will acquire a ninety percent (90%) undivided interest in and to that portion of the property to be used for active recreation, and the Town of Riverhead will acquire a ten percent (10%) undivided interest in and to that portion of the Premises to be used for active recreation, the cost of the Town's ten percent (10%) undivided interest not to exceed \$500,000.00, as tenants in common, and the County of Suffolk shall be responsible for any such costs related to the improvement of that portion of the Premises acquired for recreational use to be preserved by the County of Suffolk, for active recreational use; and

Twelve copies, plus additional copies as may be required by other levels of government with jurisdiction over the site, of the application, a current survey prepared by a licensed surveyor, the site plan (if separate from the survey) and any other submission or exhibit required by this article shall be submitted, together with the appropriate fee, to the Planning Department. The applicant shall submit a digital copy of the site plan in a common computer-aided design (CAD) file format, among them DGN, DXF and DWG, and the digital CAD drawing shall be projected in the NAD 1983 State Plane New York Long Island FIPS 3104 (feet) coordinate system. A. Presubmission Conference

Prior to the submission of a site plan application, the applicant and/or his agent may meet with the Planning Department to determine Zoning Code compliance, general engineering suitability and aesthetic compatibility. Said review shall be a process between the Planning Department staff and the project designer(s), with no time limitation or fee imposed. Plans shall include such drawings as shall

clearly represent those structural, topographical and design features that the Town would require to evaluate the proposed construction, addition, reconstruction or alteration. The anticipated result of the preliminary review shall be a preliminary site plan which shall be acceptable for formal application and review. The Presubmission Conference shall be open to the public.

B. Preliminary Site Plan Application

(1) Subsequent to the Presubmission Conference, an application for preliminary site plan approval shall be made on the form for the same provided by the Planning Department. Fourteen (14) copies, plus additional copies as may be required by other levels of government with jurisdiction over the site, of the application, a current survey prepared by a licensed surveyor, the site plan (if separate from the survey) and any other submission or exhibit required by this article shall be submitted, together with the appropriate fee, to the Planning Department.

(2) A preliminary site plan shall conform to the requirements set forth in subsection (C) (5) of this section and section 108-132 of this Code.

(3) Within ten (10) days of receipt of the preliminary site plan application the Planning Department shall determine whether or not the application is complete. The Planning Department shall reject any preliminary site plan application if it is not so complete or in conformance, and shall notify the applicant as to the reason for such rejection. Upon a determination that a preliminary site plan application is complete the Planning Department shall notify the applicant of such determination and refer the proposal to the agencies listed in section 108-131 (D) (1) of this Code as it deems appropriate.

(4) Planning Department Review

Upon determining that a preliminary site plan application is complete, the Planning Department staff shall review the application and issue a written report. Based on its review, the Planning Department shall make a determination as whether the preliminary site plan is acceptable for review by the appropriate reviewing board as set forth in this Code. A site plan shall be acceptable for board review when the proposed site plan contains all the information necessary for the reviewing board to undertake a review and all the information depicted in the site plan is accurate. If the Planning Department determines that the preliminary site plan is not acceptable for board review it shall request that the applicant modify the preliminary site plan in accordance with the written report. If the Planning Department determines that the preliminary site plan is acceptable for board review it shall place the preliminary site plan on the reviewing board's public hearing agenda for presentation by the applicant to the reviewing board.

(5) Public Hearing

a. Upon a determination that a preliminary site plan is acceptable for board review the reviewing board shall hold a public hearing to consider the application.

b. The Planning Department shall cause notice of such hearing shall be made by publication at least 10 days prior to such hearing in the official newspaper of the Town.

c. The applicant shall erect or cause to be erected a sign which shall be displayed on the parcel upon which the site plan application is made facing each public street to which the property abuts, giving notice that an application has been made to the Town of Riverhead Town Board or the Town of Riverhead Planning Board as appropriate, for preliminary site plan approval along with the time and place of the hearing. The sign shall not be located more than 10 feet from the street line and shall not be less than two feet nor more than six feet above the natural grade at the street line. The sign shall be furnished by the Planning Department and shall be the only sign to be used. The sign shall be displayed not less than 10 days immediately preceding the public hearing or any adjournment date. The applicant shall file an affidavit with the Planning Department that he/she has complied with the provisions of this section prior to the opening of the public hearing.

d. In addition, the applicant shall mail notice of the public hearing date, at least 10 days prior thereto, to every property owner, as shown on the current Town of Riverhead assessment rolls, of parcels within 200 feet of the borders of the property which is the subject of the public hearing. Such notice shall be by either certified or registered mail, return receipt requested. Proof of such notice shall consist of a copy of the assessment rolls, the return receipts, and an affidavit attesting to compliance with this mailing notification. Such proof shall be submitted to the Planning Department prior to the public hearing. No additional mailing shall be required for an adjournment.

e. At the public hearing the applicant shall present the preliminary site plan to the reviewing board. The reviewing board shall review the preliminary site plan application, the Planning Department written report, comments from any other agencies, and receive comments from the public. The reviewing board shall receive written comments for ten (10) days following the close of the public hearing. Written comments shall be sent by U.S. Mail, delivery service or hand delivered to the Town Clerk.

f. In the event a preliminary site plan application is denied the applicant may revise and resubmit the preliminary site plan, withdraw the application or prepare a submittal and prepare in accordance with the denied preliminary site plan and apply for final site plan review and approval.

(6) Decision on Preliminary Site Plan Application.

a. Based upon its review of the preliminary site plan application and such recommendations as it may receive from the Planning Department and other agencies and departments, and comments from the public, the reviewing board

shall accept, accept with modifications or deny the preliminary site plan application.

b. The preliminary site plan approval shall be valid for one year from the date of approval.

c. Upon written request by the applicant, the preliminary site plan approval may be extended for one additional year after due consideration by the reviewing board.

C. Final Site Plan Review and Approval

(1) Upon approval of a preliminary site plan by the reviewing board, or in the event the applicant elects to proceed with a denied preliminary site plan, the applicant shall prepare and submit a final site plan to the Planning Department.

(2) An application for final site plan approval shall be made on the form for the same provided by the Planning Department. Fourteen (14) copies, plus additional copies as may be required by other levels of government with jurisdiction over the site, of the application and any other submission or exhibit required by this article shall be submitted, together with the appropriate fee, to the Planning Department.

(3) Within thirty (30) days of receipt of a final site plan the Planning Department shall reject any application if it is not so complete or in conformance, and shall notify the applicant as to the reason for such rejection.

(4) Revisions to an approved final site plan or to elevations which significantly change the character or appearance of the project or which occur after the issuance of a certificate of occupancy shall require resubmission of an amended site plan and shall be charged accordingly.

(5) The site plan shall be drawn to the following minimum scales:

(a) Overall development plan sites of less than two acres: one inch equals 20 feet.

(b) Overall development plan, sites of two acres or more: one inch equals 40 feet.

(c) Detailed portions of a site plan, sites of any size: one inch equals 10 feet.

D. Further Processing.

(1) If the application is complete, the Planning Department shall retain one copy of the submission and shall forward the remainder, within seven days, to the Town Clerk. The Town Clerk shall clock all elements of the final site plan application, shall retain one copy for the Town Clerk files and shall thereupon distribute the remaining copies for review and comment as follows:

- (a) One copy to the office of the Supervisor.
- (b) One copy to the Building Department.
- (c) One copy to the Town Attorney, as appropriate.
- (d) One copy to the Town's consulting engineer as appropriate.
- (e) One copy each to the Highway Superintendent, Sewer District Superintendent and/or Water District Superintendent, as appropriate.
- (f) Two copies to the Fire Marshall. The Fire Marshall shall forward one copy to the Fire District.
- (g) One copy to the Architectural Review Board, as appropriate.
- (h) One copy to the landmark preservation Committee as appropriate.
- (i) One copy to the Handicapped Advisory Committee, as appropriate.
- (j) One copy to the Town Engineer as appropriate.
- (k) Three copies to the New York State Department of Transportation, as appropriate.
- (l) Three copies to the Suffolk County Department of Public Works as appropriate.
- (m) One copy to the Central Pine Barrens Commission, as appropriate.
- (n) One copy to the Suffolk County Planning Commission, as appropriate.
- (o) An appropriate number of copies to any other appropriate governmental agency or Town Department.

(2) The Planning Department will, upon review and receipt of comments from those named herein, initiate any amendments or revisions to the final site plan, or its component parts, through discussion with the applicant or his or her representative, in accordance with the Town Code of the Town of Riverhead and the aesthetic standards desired by the Architectural Review Board. The Planning Department will then recommend approval, approval with modifications, or disapproval in a timely fashion such that within 62 days of receipt of said completed application by the Town Clerk the appropriate reviewing board shall approve, approve with modifications, or disapprove said final site plan and shall state its reason(s) for modifications or disapproval. The time within which the Planning Board must render its decision may be extended by mutual consent of the applicant and the reviewing board.

E. The Building Department shall not issue a building permit for any site improvements which have not secured the required applicable Board site plan approval. In the event that the applicable Board requires modifications and the applicant agrees to same, the Building Department may thereupon issue a permit conforming to such modified plan without further submission to the applicable Board.

F. Inspections.

(1) Subsequent to site plan approval and the issuance of a building permit. It is the obligation of the applicant to call for site plan inspections upon the installations or construction of each of the following:

- (a) Drainage improvements prior to backfill.
- (b) Grading and site improvements prior to the first lift of paving.
- (c) Post-construction prior to the issuance of a certificate.

(2) An inspection fee of \$250 per inspection must be paid prior to each inspection and/or reinspection.

G. Fees

(1) The applicant shall submit seventy-five percent 75% of the review fee set forth in subsection B of this paragraph with the preliminary site plan application. The remainder of the review fee shall be submitted with the application for final site plan approval. An application for preliminary site plan approval and/or final site plan approval shall not be deemed complete until all fees are paid.

(2) For each site plan application submitted to the Planning Department under the provisions of this chapter, the review fee shall be \$500, plus \$0.10 per square foot of site improvements and/or altered area. The fee to review an application to amend a previously approved site plan shall be \$500. In no instance shall a site plan review exceed \$30,000. For either a preliminary site plan application or final site plan application to be deemed complete the appropriate fee must be paid. No review of a preliminary site plan or final site plan shall be undertaken until the appropriate fee is paid.

(3) Revisions to a site plan or to elevations which significantly change the character or appearance of the project or which occur after the issuance of a certificate of occupancy shall require resubmission of an amended site plan and shall be charged accordingly.

H. Effective Date

(1) The requirements of subsections A and B of this section shall only be applicable to applications received after the effective date of those subsections.
