The Town Board, by resolution, may authorize organizations other than the New York Board of Fire Underwriters to make inspections and reinspections of electrical wiring installation, devices, appliances and equipment, provided that said inspection organizations annually submit proof of general liability in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 and \$5,000,000.00 excess liability, professional liability and workers' compensation insurance, naming the Town of Riverhead as a named insured, which shall be approved as to form and sufficiency by the Town Attorney. Furthermore, the Town Attorney shall review and recommend to the Town Board said organizations which have certified to the following:

1. That the inspector(s) has a minimum of ten (10) years' experience with electrical installations;

2. That the inspector is no longer performing electrical installation work; and

3. That the inspector must have previously had a licence from the Suffolk County Electrical Licensing Board and has retired said license.

In no event shall the cost or expense of such inspections or reinspections be a charge against the town.

WHEREAS, the Riverhead Town Board considered the project alternative to be an additional project alternative; such alternative project not being adequately described in the Draft Environmental Impact Statement, and

WHEREAS, the alternative project, its impact, and mitigation measures have been described in the document entitled "Golf Course Alternative for Calverton Life Care Project" (Design Properties 1991),

WHEREAS, the Riverhead Town Board by Resolution #705 (1991), approved the Supplemental Draft Environmental Impact Statement of William Schulman and filed such notices as required by the New York State Environmental Conservation Law, and

WHEREAS, upon such filing, the Riverhead Town Board received commentary by both involved agencies and parties of interest,

WHEREAS, the Planning Department summarized the environmental issues identified by Lead Agency and involved agency review; such summary submitted to the applicant as correspondence, and

- (v) The need to assess the value of the habitat of the endangered species existing upon the project site;
- (vi) The need for an analysis of the expected impacts upon groundwater within Hydrogeologic Zone III integrated with the impact of other projects within the general vicinity;

th, the Draft Environmental Impact Statement, together with the applicant's response to commentary, forms a description of an action to the greatest extent practical, minimizes adverse impacts upon natural environment. The basis for this finding is centered in the finding that the Final Environmental Impact Statement has addressed all of the major environmental issues and impacts relating to groundwater, surface water, terrestrial ecology, transportation, parks, cultural resources, and Town planning and zoning. In its consideration of the subject special permit, the Town Board specifically finds the following:

- (i) That the golf course design as submitted as part of the subject special permit petition indicates that upper glacial groundwater flow to be away from Canoe Lake and associated freshwater wetlands and that the 100 foot non-disturbance area succeeds in protecting surface waters and wetlands from nutrient leaching;
- (ii) That as evidenced by the analysis presented to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation for the required well permit, the quantity of water required for irrigation will not impact upon the water quantity of Canoe Lake;

- (ii) That the golf course design will employ techniques including the use of certain grasses, soil modification, and the location of irrigation heads in order to both minimize irrigation and potential leaching of nutrients to the upper glacial aquifer;
- (iv) That installation of monitoring wells and monitoring program will ensure the mitigation of nutrient and chemical impacts to surface and groundwater;
- (v) That the golf course design submitted as part of the Final Environmental Impact Statement conserves that habitat necessary for the survival of the identified endangered species;
- (vi) That the archeological resources existing within the project site have been appropriately assessed and that the site is not of a kind eligible for national or state historic registers;
- (vii) That the quality of groundwater existing beneath the project site will not be impacted beyond New York State standards and that all wastewater will be discharged in conformance with Suffolk County Department of Health Services regulations;
- (viii) That the project site, though physically bounded by the Suffolk County Pine Barrens Zone, does not exhibit vegetation characteristic of a Pine Barrens habitat. Therefore, the project will have a negligible effect upon the identified Pine Barrens habitat and those species which inhabit such habitat;
- (ix) That the impact of the subject project upon the quality of the groundwater existing within the Deep Recharge Hydrogeologic Zone, when assessed cumulatively with other petitioned development projects within the general vicinity (Zone III), is not considered to be significant. This finding is based upon the fact that the amount of nitrogen to be discharged to the groundwater by the subject project is considered to be in conformance with the non-structural recommendations of the Long Island Comprehensive Waste Treatment Management Plan (208) and is expected to discharge nitrogen at a level less than that of a residential buildout at densities recommended by 208. Since all other projects being considered by the Lead Agency within the Zone III area will also be required to treat wastewater in conformance with 208 recommendations and the Suffolk County Department of Health Services, the cumulative impact of such projects is not expected to be significant. It is the judgment of the Lead Agency that 208 land use planning, and its recommendations, was predicated upon the assumption of total buildout of the privately-held land within the study area and that land development in conformance with 208 is prima facie evidence of nonsignificant impact, individually or cumulatively, upon the groundwater resource;

- (x) That the project will not have a significant impact upon surface water in that the identified surface water within the project vicinity is the Peconic River and its tributaries and such resource is protected and potential impacts mitigated through the regulation of land use by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation through Part 666;

That, having considered the Supplemental Draft Environmental Impact Statement and the Supplementary Final Environmental Impact Statement, and having considered the preceding written facts and conclusions relied upon to meet the requirements of 6 NYCRR Part 617.9, the Statement of Findings certifies that:

- (i) The requirements of 6 NYCRR Part 617 have been met;
- (ii) Consistent with the social, economic, and other essential considerations from among the reasonable alternatives thereto, the action approved is one which minimizes or avoids adverse environmental effects to the maximum extent practicable; including the effects disclosed in the Environmental Impact Statement;
- (iii) Consistent with social, economic, and other essential considerations, to the maximum extent practicable, adverse environmental effects revealed in the Environmental Impact Statement process will be minimized or avoided by incorporating as conditions to the decision those mitigative measures which were identified as practicable; and
- (iv) Consistent with the applicable policies of Article 42 of the Executive Law, as implemented by 19 NYCRR 600.5, this action will achieve a balance between the protection of the environment and the need to accommodate social and economic considerations.
