WHEREAS, The Riverhead Town Board has determined that:

- (a) The notice of hearing to consider establishment of the Riverhead Townwide Solid Waste Collection District was published and posted as required by law and sufficiently describes the proposed District;
- (b) All the properties and property owners within the proposed District will benefit by the establishment of the Riverhead Townwide Solid Waste Collection District, and all properties and property owners benefitting from the District are included within the limits of the District; and
- (c) The establishment of the Riverhead Townwide Solid Waste Collection District is in the public interest because it will:
  - 1. Provide residents within the District uniform and improved solid waste collection services coordinated with the Town's disposal system;
  - 2. Promote recycling to reduce dependence on other more costly disposal methods;
  - 3. Reduce the incentive for illegal dumping which in turn will reduce the Town's roadside cleanup costs and increase disposal revenues;
  - 4. Provide collection services at the lowest possible costs through competitive bidding and 5-year contracts;
  - 5. Enable successful carters to invest in new, safer and quieter equipment; and
  - 6. Eliminate the need to reinstitute costly fall and spring cleanup programs; and

WHEREAS, the lead agency has found that the establishment of the Riverhead Townwide Solid Waste Collection District will not have a significant environmental effect; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of the Riverhead Townwide Solid Waste Collection District does not obligate the Town Board (as directors of the District) to award service contracts for solid waste collection within the District by any specific date; and

WHEREAS, failure to award service contracts will not dissolve the establishment of the Riverhead Townwide Solid Waste Collection District but will preserve the District framework for use when the Town Board decides it is appropriate and cost-effective to do so.

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Riverhead Townwide Solid Waste Collection District is hereby established subject to permissive referendum and that:

- (a) It includes all residential properties with tax codes of 210, 220, 230, 240, 250, 260, 270 and 280 which are within the Town of Riverhead as described on the official Suffolk County Tax Map as District No. 0600;
- (b) Solid waste collection services will be provided to all residential property types as described above within the District;
- (c) Payment for such services will be assessed against all properties included within the District as a special district benefit tax--all properties with the same tax code will pay the same amount; and

- (d) The benefit tax will not be charged until such time as the Town Board awards contracts for solid waste collection services; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the description of the Riverhead Townwide Solid Waste Collection District, the report on which its establishment is based, the plan which describes the services which will be provided within the District, the method by which the cost of services will be financed, and map of the Riverhead Townwide Solid Waste Collection District are filed with the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead for public inspection.
