

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday November 27, 1934 at 10:00 A.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held on November 14, 1934 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Justice Rubenstein offered the following Resolution which was seconded by Justice Stackpole,

WHEREAS, the members of this Town Board sincerely believe that the Town of Riverhead through the death of Justice of the Peace Robert Burnside have lost a true and faithful servant and,

WHEREAS, the members of this Town Board have appreciated his efforts and enjoyed his fellowship, now therefore be it,

RESOLVED, that this Board extend to Mrs Robert Burnside and family their expression of deepest sympathy, and further,

RESOLVED, that this Resolution be spread in full on the minutes and a copy be sent to the family. The resolution was carried by the unanimous consent of the Board.

A communication was read from the Board of Education of Riverhead School District #5, Town of Riverhead, thanking the Town Board for their assistance in the transportation and planting of the trees and shrubs at the school. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication from Mrs Sarah Courtenay of Hamilton Avenue complaining of certain children in that community was read and was referred to the Police Department for investigation.

A letter of appreciation from Mrs Robert Burnside and Family was read and ordered placed on file.

A report from the Police Department showing the exact time the Street Lights were turned off for a period of two weeks was read and ordered placed on file.

Mr Carl Peterson addressed the Board and read a communication from the Young Men's Republican Club of Riverhead offering for their consideration the name of Austin H. Warner for the appointment of Justice of the Peace to fill the vacancy which now exists.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Luce it was Resolved by unanimous consent that the communication be placed on file.


Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes, presented his official bond in the amount of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars for the approval of the Board.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Stackpole it was Resolved that Bond #967720-D of the American Surety Company dated November 26, 1934, bonding Forrest G. Downs as Receiver of Taxes in the amount of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars be and the same hereby is approved as to form, manner of execution and the sufficiency of the surety, and be it further,

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and he hereby is directed to file said bond with the County Clerk. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein and Luce, yes, Supervisor Burns, yes. Total vote Yes 4, No 0. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Board then convened as Board of Audit and examined the bills for the month of November.

There being no further business on motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved that the meeting adjourn till Tuesday December 11, 1934 at 10:00 A.M.
