

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Clerk's Office on Wednesday December 1, 1936 at 2 P.M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the meeting of November 17th. were read and on motion approved.

On motion and vote, Forrest G. Downs, Tax Receiver was authorized to appoint a clerk to assist him collecting taxes for a period of ten weeks at a salary of \$30.00 per week.

On motion, duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor and Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to borrow the sum of Sixty One Hundred Seventeen and 50/100 (\$6117.50) Dollars in anticipation of taxes to retire five Water Bonds in the amount of \$1000 each, maturing December 1, 1936 and to pay the interest on Water Bonds which is due on December 1, 1936

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved that the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to borrow upon promissory note the sum of Forty Five Hundred Fifty and 93/100 (\$4550.93) Dollars to pay on account of audited bills of November 30th. 1936

Supervisor Howell having to leave the Meeting, appointed Justice Corwin as Chairman during his absence.

A communication was read from Ralph C. Brown concerning the improvements on the Town Highways. Communication was ordered placed on file.

The Committee on additional street lights reported and recommended that a street light be placed at the east end of Second Street near the residence of Robert P. Burns; that the street light on the northeast corner of Maple Avenue and Main Street be discontinued and that an ARC Light be placed above Main Street midway between the abutment of Maple Avenue and Main Street and McDermott Avenue and Main Street; that additional poles be placed on Elton Avenue bringing the last pole on Elton Avenue to the intersection of Elton Avenue and Fishel Avenue and that two additional lights be placed in this section.

On motion duly, made seconded and carried it was RESOLVED that a street light be placed on Second Street at the easterly end of said street near the residence of Robert P. Burns; that the street light on the northeast corner of Maple Avenue and Main Street be discontinued and that an ARC LIGHT be placed above Main Street midway between the abutment of Maple Avenue and Main Street and McDermott Avenue and Main Street; that additional poles be placed on Elton Avenue as far east as Fishel Avenue and that two street lights be placed in this section.

Mr. Lester Shiebel, representing the American Legion of Riverhead, addressed the Board about the Parking Regulations on Roanoke Avenue near the School and of the dangerous method now in use of allowing cars to stop and children to alight on the east side of Roanoke Avenue and cross the street to the School.

Mr. Shiebel advised the Board that he had talked with Mr. Schafer about a plan requiring the cars to stop to discharge children only on the westerly side of Roanoke Avenue near the School.

The Board advised Mr. Shiebel to confer with Mr. Schafer and draw up an ordinance for the consideration of the Board.

Justice Burnside reported on the New York State Employees Retirement System and recommended that the Board pass a resolution approving of the inclusion of the Officers and Employees of Riverhead Town in said System.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk, State of New York, approve of the inclusion of the officers and employees of the Town of Riverhead in the New York State Employees' Retirement System which system is provided by Chapter 741 of the Laws of 1920 as amended, being Article 4 of the Civil Service Law, and which inclusion, together with the condition of same, is provided for in Chapter 591 in the Laws of 1922, being Article 5 of the Civil Service Law.

On motion and vote the Meeting adjourned to meet on Monday December 13th. 1926 at South Jamesport, N.Y.
