A communication was read from the Suffolk County Department of thways in regard to a bill from the Estate of Elizabeth Morell in the amount \$187.50 for two and one half years rent for a drainage pripe across said ties property on East Main Street stating that they have no fund out of ich to pay same.

In the opinion of the Town Attorney the Town has no legal right pay the above bill and that it is a matter which should be settled between Suffolk County Highway Department and the Morell Estate.

A communication from Assistant County Attorney, Guy O. Walser in ard to a date for a public hearing in the Town of Riverhead to discuss the ffolk County Tax Act, was read. The matter was referred to the Supervisor.

A communication from Mr. Leonard Fisher of Jamesport, New York ling a claim for the breakage of three windows in his place of business at corner of Washington Avenue and Main Street said to have been caused by mes being kicked up by cars from the highway. The matter was referred to Highway Committee and the Supt. of Highways.
