

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, February 13, 1935 at 10:00 A. M.

Reginald C. Smith, Town Attorney, was present.

Minutes of meetings of the Town Board held on January 30, 1935 and February 1, 1935 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

The matter of buildings being on the highway south of the Railroad tracks at Jamesport was brought to the attention of the Board.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Luce it was RESOLVED by unanimous consent that the matter be referred to the Town Attorney.

A communication from the Suffolk County Taxpayers Association in regard to authorizing the County Treasurer to transfer money from the County Road Fund to the accounts of the Highway Bonded Indebtedness Principle and Interest Account, was read and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

A communication from Mr. L. C. Austin, President of the Civic Club of Riverhead, disapproving of the semi-annual payment of taxes, and urging the Town Board to adopt a Resolution urging the Supervisors to disapprove of the plan was read and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

A communication from the members of the Board of Education disapproving of the semi-annual payment of taxes was read and on motion and vote ordered placed on file.

William H. Clark, Supt. of Highways, informed the Board that the funds for snow removal is completely depleted, and requested more funds to meet his payrolls.

Justice Rubenstein offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Luce

WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that the amount levied and collected for the expenditure actually necessary for the removal of obstructions caused by snow are insufficient to pay expenses necessarily incurred, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to borrow the sum of Fifteen Hundred (\$1500.00) Dollars to be used for the removal of snow. The vote, Justices Stackpole and Hallock, absent, Justices Rubenstein and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 3, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as Board of Audit.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Luce it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized and directed, upon the order of the Welfare Officer, to pay the Welfare bills for the month of January, 1935. The vote, Justices Stackpole and Hallock, absent, Justices Rubenstein and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 3, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned at 11:45 A. M. till February 27, 1935 at 10:00 A. M.
