

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, March 13, 1935 at 10 A.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on Feb., 27, 1935 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Long Island Lighting Company establishing reduced prices for overhead series street lighting lamps, which will be applied to the existing contracts covering the lighting districts in the Town of Riverhead, to be effective on and after March 1, 1935. On motion and vote the communication was placed on file.

A communication was read from the Department of Audit and Control in regard to contributions to the funds of the Employees' Retirement System, inclosing a bill for \$3136.20. The communication was referred to the Town Attorney.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Stackpole it was RESOLVED, by unanimous consent, that a representative of the T.E.R.A. be invited to attend our next regular meeting in order that the matter of wage scale for laborers may be discussed.

Justices Hallock and Luce, Committee on the matter of the drain through the Danielowich Brothers property, reported that the Town has gone to considerable expense in putting in the drain, that the drain is very necessary and recommended that \$25.00 per year be paid for the year 1934.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Stackpole it was RESOLVED, by unanimous consent, that the report of the above Committee be accepted.

The matter of policing the Post Office lobby was brought to the attention of the Board and referred to Chief Walker.

Town Attorney Smith was present at 10:30 A. M.

The Town Clerk advised the Board that he has filed the bonds of Justice Rubenstein and Special Policeman John H. Leonard with the County Clerk and has filed the receipts for same in his office.

Mr. Daniel R. Young addressed the Board in regard to water flowing on private property of the Long Island Produce and Fertilizer Co., on Pulaski Street near Claus Avenue stating that the Produce Company is contemplating erecting a building on that property but is unable to do so on account of the drainage problem. He presented a map showing the condition which now exists and requested the Board to take some action.


On motion duly made by Justice Hallock and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to engage an Engineer to prepare an estimate of cost of the above matter and submit it as a project to the T.E.R.A. and further

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be authorized to negotiate with the Long Island Produce and Fertilizer Company to bear their share of the expense. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Mr. Daniel R. Young addressed the Board in regard to the proposed alteration of Middle Road near Deep Hole Road and submitted a map showing the proposed alteration. On motion and vote it was referred to a Committee composed of Justices Hallock and Luce for investigation.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Welfare bills for the month of February.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned till March 27, 1935 at 10:00 A. M.
