

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, March 27, 1935 at 10:00 A. M.

Town Attorney Smith and Supt. of Highways Clark were present.

Minutes of a meeting held on March 13, 1935 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication from the Civic Association of Huntington in regard to the tax laws was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Riverhead Polish Independent Club, requesting no parking signs in front of the St. Isidore's R. C. Church and the Polish Hall was read and on motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried the matter was referred to the Supt. of Highways.

Mr. George W. Hildreth addressed the Board in regard to the dredging and improvement of Peconic River.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Luce it was RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, New York, is heartily in sympathy with the application of the Riverhead Yacht Club to the War Department for an appropriation for the dredging and improvement of Peconic River, and respectfully requests the War Department to give this application favorable consideration. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The matter of printing the Fire Ordinances in book form was discussed. Supervisor Burns reported that the Riverhead News would print 500 copies for the sum of \$82.00.

On motion duly made by Justice Hallock and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED that 500 copies of the Riverhead Town Fire Ordinances be printed in book form by the Riverhead News for the sum of \$82.00. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication from Charles Weller, Sr., making application for the position of Fire Inspector for the Town of Riverhead was read and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

A communication from Mrs Lester Crowley making application for permission to operate the refreshment stand at the Howell M. Reeve Park for the coming season was read and ordered placed on the Town Board calendar for the last meeting in April, together with the other applications now on file.

Justices Hallock and Luce a Committee on the matter of the alteration of Middle Road, near Deep Hole Road reported favorable and recommended that the alteration be made.

Justice Luce offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Rubenstein

WHEREAS, Daniel R. Young, a person assessable for highway taxes in the Town of Riverhead, has heretofore made application to Supt. of Highways of the said town to make an alteration of a portion of the Highway known as Middle Road in the Town of Riverhead. The northerly line of alteration beginning at a point S. 86° 51' W., 286.72 feet from a concrete monument set on the northerly line of Middle Road at the third angle east of the Deep Hole Road and running thence S. 63° 30' W., 303.75 feet; thence S. 80° 46' W., 228.2 feet; thence N. 86° 06' W., 167.5 feet to a point in the easterly line of Deep Hole Road which is 65.8 feet northerly from the intersection of the easterly line of Deep Hole Road and the northerly line of Middle Road. The southerly line of alteration beginning at a point S. 86° 51' W., 273.72 feet from a concrete monument set on the southerly line of Middle Road at the third angle east of Deep Hole Road and running thence S. 63° 30' W., 301.05 feet thence S. 80° 46' W., 331.31 feet to a concrete monument on the southerly side of Middle Road opposite the Deep Hole Road. All of which is shown on a certain map of alteration of Middle Road near Deep Hole Road in Riverhead Town, Suffolk County, New York, dated Jan. 4, 1934 and surveyed by D. R. Young, P. E. & L. S. and A. W. Young, L. S. of Riverhead, New York, attached hereto.

AND WHEREAS Walter Kobylinski and Anna Kobylinski owners of the property thereby affected and agreed to release to said Town their land affected by said alteration for the sum of \$75.00.

NOW BE IT RESOLVED, pursuant to the provisions of Section 191 of the Highway Law, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, hereby consent that the Town Superintendent of Highways of said Town, make an order laying out such highway upon filing and recording in the County Clerk's Office and the Town Clerk's Office, a map of said proposed highway, and a release of the land from the owners thereof. And that the sum of \$75.00 be paid to the said Walter Kobylinski and Anna Kobylinski. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total votes, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The matter of the claim of Frances Bogan against the Town of Riverhead for damages for personal injuries was brought to the attention of the Board.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Hallock, it was RESOLVED that the Clerk be and he hereby is directed to report the above claim to the Travelers Insurance Company, requesting that they defend and indemnify the Town from any loss it may sustain by reason of this claim, and further

RESOLVED that the Town Attorney be directed to assist in the matter. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous consent of the Board.

A petition requesting a larger street lamp on the corner of Roanoke Avenue and Elton Street was presented to the Board.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Stackpole, it was RESOLVED that the Clerk be and he hereby is authorized and directed to order the Long Island Lighting Company to change the existing light on the corner of Roanoke Avenue and Elton Street from an 80 C. P. to a 250 C. P. lamp. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The matter of a cemetery plotⁱⁿ Welfare cases was brought to the attention of the Board and on motion and vote was ordered laid on the table.

The Supervisor's report for the month of February was presented to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted as submitted and ordered placed on file.

On motion duly made by Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Stackpole, it was RESOLVED that the Officer in Charge of the Riverhead Police Department be and he hereby is authorized to purchase a motorcycle for the use of the Police Department and be it further

RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to expend the sum not to exceed \$450.00 for the purpose of purchasing same. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board recessed at 12:15 noon to convene at 1:30 P. M.
