

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, October 2, 1935 at 9:00 A. M.

Town Attorney Smith and Supt. of Highways Clark were present.

Minutes of the meetings of the Town Board held on September 11, 1935 and September 18, 1935 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

John M. Burgess, Jr., Special Policeman of the Town of Riverhead addressed the Board stating that the Policemen of the Town have joined the Police Benevolent Association of New York State and asked the Board's approval in the matter. On motion and vote the Board expressed their approval.

On motion made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Hallock, it was RESOLVED that this resolution be retroactive to a resolution passed on the 28th day of September, 1935 appointing a Special Constable for School duty and that the name of Stanley Brandt be stricken out and that the name of Daniel Roche be inserted and further

RESOLVED that the Bond of Daniel Roche, Special Constable be fixed at \$500.00 and be it further

RESOLVED that this resolution be affective as of the 28th day of September, 1935. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Rubenstein, it was RESOLVED that there be submitted at the BIENNIAL TOWN ELECTION to be held on the 5th day of November, 1935, pursuant to Article VI of the Town Law and for the consideration of the duly qualified electors of the Town of Riverhead, the following proposition:

PROPOSITION #1. Shall the Town of Riverhead establish and maintain a public park on lands belonging to the Town of Riverhead known as the "Howell M. Reeve Park" and expend in such establishment not more than \$100.00, (One Hundred Dollars).

Lands affected by said proposition are situate, lying and being in the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk and State of New York,

at Sound Avenue, also known as Centerville, and bounded and described as follows:

BEGINNING at the intersection of the northeast corner of the property hereby conveyed and the northwest corner of the property of Ira M. Young at a point on the line of ordinary high water mark of Long Island Sound, (as shown by survey certified to the Title Guarantee and Trust Company May 16, 1917, by Wallace H. Halsey, Southampton N. Y.): thence S. 19 42' 30" E. 2224.33 feet along the westerly line of the land of said Ira M. Young; thence S. 70 36' 30" W. 275 feet along land formerly of George O. Robinson, now of Harold Robinson; thence N. 19 41' 13" W. 2243.82 feet to ordinary high water mark of Long Island Sound; thence along the ordinary high water mark of Long Island Sound N. 74 42' 30" E. 275 feet to the point or place of beginning. Containing by estimation fourteen acres be the same more or less, but the boundaries above described to control and not the number of acres.

PROPOSITION # 2. Shall the Town of Riverhead expend for the purpose of gardening and attending grounds of Suffolk County Historical Society in 1936 the sum of \$150.00 and in 1937 the sum of \$150.00.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Clerk is hereby directed to post and publish the notice of the submission of such propositions pursuant to Statute. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Luce, Rubenstein and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The report of Raymond Benjamin, Life Guard at the Howell M. Reeve Park was read and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

The affidavits of publishing and posting of the notice of the appropriation of the sum of \$200.00 for channel markers in Peconic River was presented to the Board and ordered placed on file.

On motion of Justice Rubenstein and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to transfer the sum of \$784.64 from the Surplus Account to the Municipal Indebtedness Account. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED that the following annual estimate of revenues and expenditures for the ensuing year be adopted.



On motion duly made by Justice Stackpole and seconded by Justice Luce it was RESOLVED that the Clerk give notice of the adoption and filing of the foregoing annual estimate which shall set forth said estimate in full and that a hearing will be held for the review thereof at a meeting of the Town Board at the Town Hall on the 16th day of October, 1935 at 7:30 P. M. and further

RESOLVED that the Clerk publish such notice in the County Review at Riverhead, N. Y. pursuant to Law. The vote, Justices Stackpole, Rubenstein, Luce and Hallock, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Town bills for the month of September, 1935.

There being no further business, on motion made by Justice Hallock and seconded by Justice Luce it was RESOLVED that the meeting adjourn till Wednesday, October 9, 1935 at 10:00 A. M. and that the meeting also be extended to the evening at 7:30 P. M.
