

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Friday, February 4, 1949 at 2:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on January 19, 1949 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Auxiliary of the Veterans of Foreign Wars requesting permission to use the property in the rear of the highway barn for a carnival during the week of June 13th through the 18th, 1949. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the request of the Auxiliary of the Veterans of Foreign Wars for permission to use the ground in the rear of the highway barn during the week beginning on June 18th, 1949 be granted, provided that the grounds be left as clean as when entered upon and the necessary liability insurance be posted and further that the space to be used is to be designated by the Supt. of Highways. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

Applications for permission to operate bus lines in the Town of Riverhead by Louis A. Fuoco from Riverhead to Patchogue and by Henry W. Adelwerth from Riverhead to Center Moriches over the same route was submitted to the Board. The applications were ordered placed on file.

It was the unanimous opinion of the Board that whereas the Board had already granted permission to the Sunrise Transportation Co. to operate over the same route as the above applications, in so far as the Town of Riverhead is concerned, no other applications will be considered until the matter regarding the Sunrise Transportation Co. application is settled.

A communication was read from Harry G. Penny, Treasurer of the River-Fire Department together with his annual report for 1948 and on motion and vote were ordered placed on file.

The Supervisor's report for the month of January 1949 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

The Police report for the month of January 1949 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

The Tax Receiver's report as of February 1, 1949 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

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On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the Supervisor be authorized to pay the Mico Art Bronze Company the sum of \$719.81, said sum being one half of the gross receipts from the parking meters during the month of January 1949 pursuant to the agreement between the Mico Art Bronze Co. and the Town of Riverhead. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

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A request to put/antenna from the house of Dr. Harold B. Smith to the Wiesen Building across the property now rented by the Town on Roanoke Avenue for a parking field was presented to the Board. The Town Board had no objection to the request, provided there was no objection on the part of the Landlords.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the Supervisor be authorized to transfer the sum of \$2000.00 from the Reeves Park Account to the General Town Account. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the Town of Riverhead request permission from the New York State Dept. of Public Works to widen Peconic Avenue and to replace curbs and sidewalks from Main Street south to 34th Street, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the State of New York and/or its agents, servants and employees shall not be liable for injuries to persons and/or property, not caused by the State of New York, its agents, servants or employees, which may occur during the repairing and/or building by the Riverhead Town Superintendent of Highways of the aforesaid Peconic Avenue and the replacement of the curbs and sidewalks. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, February 16, 1949 at 9:00 A.M.
