

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, December 7, 1949 at 2:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on November 16, 1949 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from Counsel #184 of the Polish National Alliance of Riverhead making application for permission to hold its annual carnival on the premises in the rear of the highway barn, off of Osborn Ave., during the Decoration Day week in May of 1950. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the application of Counsel #184 of the Polish National Alliance of Riverhead for permission to hold its annual carnival on the premises in the rear of the highway barn, off of Osborn Avenue, during Decoration Day week in May of 1950 be granted, provided that the Carnival Company post the required liability insurance and deposit the sum of \$100.00 with the Town of Riverhead before entering the premises, said sum to be returned after inspection shows that the premises were left in the same condition as when entered upon. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A communication was read from Harry G. Penny, Secretary of the Riverhead Fire Department stating that at the last fire district Commissioner's meeting a report was made by the Eagle Hose Co. located on Hamilton Ave. that they are experiencing considerable difficulty with cars parking too close to the fire house, also that they are having trouble at the intersection of Hamilton Avenue and Pulaski Street. The matter was referred to the Police Committee and the Supt. of Highways for study and report.

A communication was read from L.Y. Robinson asking the Board if it would accept a strip of land from Elton Street to Middle Road which would be an extension of Ostrander Avenue for a town highway if it was put in proper condition. On motion and vote the communication was ordered placed on file and a copy thereof sent to the Planning Board for its recommendation.

A communication was read from Lee Hollingsworth asking the Board to make him an offer for a piece of land at the corner of Raynor Avenue and Pulaski Street for the purpose of straightening Pulaski Street in that vicinity. The matter was referred to the Highway Committee and the Supt. of Highways for recommendation and report.

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A communication was read from the Association of Towns of the State of New York advising that the annual meeting will be held at the Hotel Commodore in the City of New York to open at 2:00 P.M. on Monday February 6th and to run through Wednesday, February 8, 1950. The communication was ordered placed on file.

The Supervisor's report for the month of November 1949 was presented to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Police report for the month of November 1949 was presented to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes requesting the Board to confirm the appointments of Ida E. Vail, Helen Maks and Helen Kukla as temporary clerks to the Receiver of Taxes to serve for such time and at such rate of pay as the Board may designate, pursuant to Section 20, Chapter 187 of the Suffolk County Tax Act. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the appointments of Ida E. Vail, Helen Maks and Helen Kukla as temporary clerks to the Receiver of Taxes, to serve at the discretion of the Receiver of Taxes, salaries fixed at the rate of \$6.00 per day. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that notice be given that a public hearing will be held on the matter of awarding the contracts for fire protection for the Riverhead Fire Protection District on Wednesday, December 28, 1949 to be held in the Town Hall at 10:00 A.M. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that Bond No. B-350667 of the Great American Indemnity Co. bonding Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes, Town of Riverhead, in the amount of \$25,000.00 be and the same is hereby approved as to form, manner of execution and the sufficiency of the surety. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Board of Assessors appeared before the Board and advised that they must have more room in order that they may be able to do their work more efficiently. The matter was referred to a Committee of the Town Board as a whole to study the matter.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the Supervisor be authorized to pay the Michaels Art Bronze Company the sum of \$724.68, said sum being one-half of the gross receipts from the parking meters during the month of November, 1949. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that Joseph A. Wienski be and he hereby is appointed Dog

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Enumerator for the year 1950, salary fixed by the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town bills to date, the totals of which are as follows: General Town Fund-\$8,230.21; Water District Fund-\$2,137.82 and the Highway Machinery Fund-\$737.89.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the amounts of the Officer's Bonds be fixed as follows:

Supervisor's General Town Bond at	\$40,000.00
Supervisor's Highway Bond at	40,000.00
Supervisor's " State Aid Bond at	6,000.00
Justices of the Peace Bonds each at	1,000.00
Superintendent of Highway's Bond at	2,000.00

Water District Clerk's Bond at	1,000.00

The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, December 21, 1949 at 2:00 P.M.
