COUNCILMAN BELL OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS

RESOLVED THAT THE MINUTES OF THE MEETINGS OF THE TOWN BOARD
HELD ON JUNE 28, 1961 AND JULY 6, 1961 BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES,
JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD,
YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

MRS. ALBERT E. SMITH OF SAYVILLE, N.Y., REPRESENTING THE REEVES
PARK CIVIC ASSOCIATION, INC., APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND REQUEST
ED THE FOLLOWING FOR THE REEVES PARK PUBLIC BEACH.

1. BETTER PARKING FACILITIES.

REFERRED TO HIGHWAY COMMITTEE.

2. BATHROOM BUILDINGS BE LEFT OPEN DURING TIME
BEACH IS OPEN TO PUBLIC.

REFERRED TO SUPERVISOR LEONARD.

3. FIND METHOD TO KEEP CLAY FROM COMING DOWN
HILLS ONTO BEACH.

REFERRED TO HIGHWAY COMMITTEE.

4. REBUILD SHELTER ON BEACH.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT THE
SHELTER BE RECONSTRUCTED. REFERRED TO
HIGHWAY COMMITTEE.

5. RED CROSS SWIMMING INSTRUCTION TO BE HELD AT
THE BEACH.

SUPERVISOR LEONARD STATED THAT THE RED CROSS
MAKES ITS OWN SELECTION OF BEACHES AT WHICH
IT CONDUCTS SWIMMING INSTRUCTION AND REQUESTED
MRS. SMITH TO CONTACT THE RED CROSS.

6. REBUILD STAIRS DOWN TO BEACH AREA.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT DUE TO
THE DIFFICULTY OF MAINTAINING SAID STAIRS, AS
THEY HAVE BEEN WASHED OUT SEVERAL TIMES BY
HURRICANES AND HIGH TIDES, THAT SAID STAIRS
NOT BE REBUILT.

7. BETTER CLEANUP OF BEACH.

RECREATION DIRECTOR KENNETH ROWLAND STATED

THAT THE BEACH IS CLEANED TWICE A DAY BY THE LIFEGUARD.

8. BETTER POLICE PATROL OF THE AREA.

CHIEF OF POLICE GRODSKI REPLIED THAT THE ROADS ON THE WEST SIDE OF PARK ROAD ARE PRIVATE ROADS AND ARE NOT PATROLLED, BUT THAT OTHER AREAS ARE PATROLLED AS OFTEN AS POSSIBLE.

A COMMUNICATION DATED JULY 17, 1961 FROM WAT J. MOLONGHNEY, PRESIDENT, REEVES PARK ESTATES CIVIC ASSOCIATION, INC., WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD.

SAID COMMUNICATION REQUESTED SEVERAL ITEMS FOR REEVES PARK THAT WERE BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF THE BOARD BY MRS. ALBERT E. SMITH. HE FURTHER REQUESTED THE FOLLOWING:

1. ERECTION OF A SOFTBALL DIAMOND AND BACKSTOP IN THE UPPER PARKING LOT.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT THE PARKING LOT WAS CONSTRUCTED AT CONSIDERABLE COST AND THEY DID NOT FEEL THAT A SOFTBALL DIAMOND AND BACKSTOP SHOULD BE CONSTRUCTED THEREON. REQUEST DENIED.

2. LITERATURE RELATIVE TO THE BURNING OF GARBAGE IN THE AREA BY PRIVATE INDIVIDUALS.

THE TOWN CLERK WAS INSTRUCTED TO FORWARD A COPY OF THE FIRE ORDINANCE.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED JULY 11, 1961 FROM CHARLES E. BOARDMAN, SOUTH JAMESPORT, N.Y., WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD RELATIVE TO A DEEP HOLE IN THE BAY AT THE FOOT OF WILLOW STREET IN SOUTH JAMESPORT. HE REQUESTED THAT THE TOWN MARK THIS DEEP HOLE WITH SIGNS. MATTER REFERRED TO THE CHIEF OF POLICE AND THE HIGHWAY COMMITTEE. COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED. *to here.*

A COMMUNICATION DATED JULY 14, 1961 FROM THE NORTHVILLE BEACH CIVIC ASSOCIATION WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"AT THE RECENT ANNUAL MEETING OF THE NORTHVILLE BEACH CIVIC ASSOCIATION I WAS INSTRUCTED TO INFORM YOU THAT ON TWO OR THREE OCCASIONS DURING THIS PAST WINTER, WHEN THERE WAS NEED TO CALL ON THE RIVERHEAD POLICE FOR ASSISTANCE, THERE WAS IMMEDIATE AND MOST HELPFUL RESPONSE AND THE AID RENDERED WAS MOST SATISFACTORY. WE WISH YOU TO KNOW THAT WE DEEPLY APPRECIATE THIS."

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED JULY 5, 1961 FROM THE SUFFOLK COUNTY CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"THIS WILL ACKNOWLEDGE RECEIPT OF YOUR LETTER OF JUNE 23, CONTAINING A COPY OF YOUR TOWN BOARD RESOLUTION REQUIRING MEMBERS OF YOUR POLICE

DEPARTMENT TO RESIDE WITHIN YOUR TOWN. I SHOULD LIKE TO DIRECT YOUR ATTENTION TO THE FACT THAT THE LEGISLATION REFERRED TO IN THE TOWN BOARD RESOLUTION MADE IT POSSIBLE TO REQUIRE RESIDENCY AFTER JULY 1, 1961. YOUR RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED ON JUNE 20, AND WAS TO TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY. I REALIZE THAT THIS IS A RATHER TECHNICAL POINT, BUT CALL IT TO YOUR ATTENTION SO THAT THE TOWN BOARD MAY AMEND IT TO CONFORM WITH THE LAW." END.

"I SPOKE TO MR. ZARON TODAY. I INDICATED TO HIM THAT OUR RESOLUTION RECITED "PURSUANT TO AUTHORIZATION RECENTLY GRANTED TO MUNICIPALITIES BY LEGISLATION". THIS HAD THE LEGAL EFFECT OF MAKING ANY RESOLUTION WHICH WAS PASSED PREVIOUSLY EFFECTIVE AS OF JULY 1ST. HE WAS SATISFIED THEREFORE AND HIS LETTER MAY BE DISREGARDED IN REGARD TO THE NECESSITY OF ANY FURTHER ACTION ON OUR PART." END.

A COMMUNICATION DATED JULY 10, 1961 FROM THE JAMESPORT-SOUTH JAMESPORT CIVIC ASSOCIATION WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD REQUESTING IMPROVED STREET LIGHTING ON MAIN STREET, JAMESPORT, FROM ROUTE 25 TO PECONIC BAY.

JUSTICE ZALOGA OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

A NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING TO AMEND THE BUILDING ZONE ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF SOUTHAMPTON TO BE HELD ON JULY 18, 1961 WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED FILED.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

WHEREAS, APPLICATION FOR CONSTRUCTION OF CURBS AND GUTTERS AND SIDEWALK HAS BEEN MADE BY CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 2, PULASKI STREET, TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, N.Y.,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT CURBS AND GUTTERS SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED ALONG SCHOOL STREET AND NORTH GRIFFING AVENUE, ALSO 10 FOOT SIDEWALK ALONG HARRISON AVENUE, WITH CURBS AND GUTTERS, ADJACENT TO THE PROPERTY OF CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 2, PURSUANT TO A CONTRACT, THE FORM OF WHICH IS HERETO ANNEXED.

CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF CURBS,
GUTTERS & SIDEWALK

TOWN HIGHWAY

THIS AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK AND CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 2, OF PULASKI STREET, TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, NEW YORK, ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNERS.

THE TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1. THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD AGREES TO CONSTRUCT CONCRETE CURBS AND GUTTERS ALONG SCHOOL STREET AND NORTH GRIFFING AVE, ALSO 10 FOOT SIDEWALK ALONG HARRISON AVENUE, WITH CURBS AND GUTTERS, ADJACENT TO THE PROPERTY OF THE PROPERTY OWNERS HEREIN SET FORTH.
2. THE GRADES AND LINES WILL BE ESTABLISHED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.

3. THE MATERIALS WILL BE DELIVERED AND THE LABOR PERFORMED AT TIMES AND IN A FORM AND MANNER SPECIFIED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.
4. THE TIME OF COMMENCEMENT AND COMPLETION OF THE WORK SHALL BE DETERMINED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.
5. ALL LABOR USED AND ALL MATERIALS FURNISHED SHALL CONFORM TO NEW YORK STATE SPECIFICATIONS.
6. THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE OF THE CURB, GUTTERS AND SIDEWALK SHALL BE THE OBLIGATION OF THE TOWN.
7. THE ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNERS, IN CONSIDERATION OF THESE PRESENTS AND OTHER CONSIDERATIONS HEREIN PERFORMED AND TO BE PERFORMED BY THE SAID TOWN, DO HEREWITH PAY TO THE SAID TOWN THE SUM OF \$4,967.50, WHICH IS THE SUM TO REIMBURSE THE TOWN FOR THE COST OF THE MATERIALS.

THAT THE EXPENSE TO THE TOWN SHALL NOT EXCEED THE SUM OF \$4,967.50.

THAT THE SUPERVISOR BE AUTHORIZED TO SIGN THE SAID CONTRACT IN BEHALF OF THE TOWN WHEN THE MONEY TO BE PAID BY SAID CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 2 IS TURNED OVER AND THE CONTRACT HAS BEEN SIGNED BY HIM, AND THEN

THAT THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS BE DIRECTED TO PERFORM THE WORK.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT CURBS AND GUTTERS SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED ALONG OSTRANDER AVENUE AND FURTHER LANE, ADJACENT TO THE PROPERTIES OF EDWARD D. PAINTER, CONSTANTINE P. KING, ROBERT VOJVODA, JOSEPH SHAFFERY AND ROBERT TOMMASINI, PURSUANT TO A CONTRACT, THE FORM OF WHICH IS HERETO ANNEXED.

CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF CURBS & GUTTERS

TOWN HIGHWAYS

THIS AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK AND EDWARD D. PAINTER OF OSTRANDER AVENUE AND CONSTANTINE P. KING, ROBERT VOJVODA, JOSEPH SHAFFERY AND ROBERT TOMMASINI, ALL OF FURTHER LANE, TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, ADJACENT PERPERTY OWNERS.

THE TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1. THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD AGREES TO CONSTRUCT CURBS AND GUTTERS ALONG OSTRANDER AVENUE AND FURTHER LANE, TOWN HIGHWAYS IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD.
2. THE GRADES AND LINES WILL BE ESTABLISHED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.

3. THE MATERIALS WILL BE DELIVERED AND THE LABOR PERFORMED AT TIMES AND IN A FORM AND MANNER SPECIFIED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.
4. THE TIME AND COMMENCEMENT AND COMPLETION OF THE WORK SHALL BE DETERMINED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.
5. ALL LABOR USED AND ALL MATERIALS FURNISHED SHALL CONFORM TO NEW YORK STATE SPECIFICATIONS.
6. THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE OF THE CURBS AND GUTTERS SHALL BE THE OBLIGATION OF THE TOWN.
7. THE ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNERS, IN CONSIDERATION OF THESE PRESENTS AND OTHER CONSIDERATIONS HEREIN PERFORMED AND TO BE PERFORMED BY SAID TOWN, DOES HEREWITH PAY TO THE SAID TOWN THE FOLLOWING SUMS:

EDWARD D. PAINTER-----	\$ 50.00
ROBERT VOJVODA-----	387.00
CONSTANTINE P. KING-----	150.00
JOSEPH SHAFFERY-----	252.00
ROBERT TOMMASINI-----	100.00

WHICH IS THE SUM TO REIMBURSE THE TOWN FOR THE COST OF THE MATERIALS.

THAT THE EXPENSE TO THE TOWN SHALL NOT EXCEED THE SUM OF \$1,573.00 (PAINTER, \$125.00, VOJVODA, \$806.50, KING, \$300.00, SHAFFERY, \$554.00 AND TOMMASINI, \$200.00).

THAT THE SUPERVISOR BE AUTHORIZED TO SIGN THE SAID CONTRACTS IN BEHALF OF THE TOWN WHEN THE MONEY TO BE PAID BY SAID EDWARD D. PAINTER, ROBERT VOJVODA, CONSTANTINE P. KING, JOSEPH SHAFFERY AND ROBERT TOMMASINI IS TURNED OVER AND THE CONTRACT HAS BEEN SIGNED BY THEM, AND THEN

THAT THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS BE DIRECTED TO PERFORM THE WORK.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

A DISCUSSION WAS HELD RELATIVE TO A CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION FOR POLICE LIEUTENANTS.

SUPERVISOR LEONARD REPORTED THAT CIVIL SERVICE DID NOT INTEND TO HOLD SUCH EXAMINATION IN THE NEAR FUTURE AND THAT THE PRESENT LIEUTENANT LIST EXPIRES SEPTEMBER 20, 1961, UNLESS IT IS CERTIFIED.

A DISCUSSION WAS HELD RELATIVE TO THE APPLICATION OF JOHN H. MULLER, WADING RIVER, TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE, WHICH WAS SUBMITTED BY MR. FRED SMYDER OF WADING RIVER.

TOWN ATTORNEY HARDING AND ALDEN W. YOUNG STATED THAT AFTER CONFERENCES WITH MR. SMYDER HE ADVISED THEM THAT SAID APPLICATION BE TEMPORARILY WITHDRAWN.

THE TOWN BOARD CONVENED AS A BOARD OF AUDIT AND EXAMINED ALL BILLS TO DATE, THE TOTAL OF WHICH WAS AS FOLLOWS: GENERAL TOWN--- \$3,767.52. ON MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY AND SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT THE BILLS BE APPROVED AS RENDERED. THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES,

JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR
LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS ON MOTION AND VOTE, THE
MEETING ADJOURNED TO MEET ON TUESDAY, AUGUST 1, 1961 AT 9:30 A.M.
