

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, January 19, 1944 at 3:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney was present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on January 5, 1944 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Supervisor Kelly welcomed Arthur H. Lundberg as Town Attorney and wished him every success during his term of office.

Town Attorney Lundberg thanked the Board and assured them that he will serve the Town to the best of his ability.

On motion made by Justice Smith and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved, that Bond No. 2018862 of the Fidelity and Casualty Company, bonding Austin H. Warner, Justice of the Peace of the Town of Riverhead in the amount of \$1000.00 be and the same is hereby approved as to form manner of execution and the sufficiency of the surety. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A communication was read from the Riverhead Merchant's Association approving the erection of a suitable Service Men's Honor Roll, as soon as possible. On motion and vote the communication was ordered placed on file.

Harry G. Penny, Treasurer of the Riverhead Fire Dept. submitted the annual report of the Riverhead Fire District pursuant to Section 181 of the Town Law. On motion and vote the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Franklin H. Young offering to sell to the Town of Riverhead a tract of land which is adjacent to the Town Dump. The matter was ordered placed on the calendar for the next regular Town Board meeting.

Supervisor Kelly submitted his report for the month of December 1943 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Supervisor's Annual Report for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1943 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

Forrest G. Downs submitted a report of the amount of taxes collected as of January 17, 1944 and on motion and vote was ordered placed on File.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it


was Resolved that the regular meetings of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead be held on the first and third Wednesdays of each month. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the Riverhead News be and it hereby is designated the Official Newspaper for the Town of Riverhead. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik and Leonard Yes, Justice Smith No, Supervisor Kelly No. Total Vote, Yes 3, No 2. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Supervisor Kelly before voting on the above resolution stated that to his knowledge or as long as he has been an official of the Town, it has always been the practice of this Board to alternate the designation of the official paper of the Town between the ~~the Riverhead News~~ and the County Review. Last year the Riverhead News was the official paper and it is no more than right that the Review should be designated this year. He stated that he did not oppose the Newspaper but that he definitely objected to doing away with the precedent of alternation. ~~which is only just and fair.~~

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Welfare bills for the month of December 1943.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, February 2, 1944 at 2:00 P.M.
