

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, June 29, 1927 at 2 P.M.

The minutes of the meeting of June 20, 1927 were read and on motion adopted.

The legal opinion as to the authority of the Town to pay for the additional lettering placed on the World War Memorial was read and ordered placed on file.

Justice Corwin brought to the attention of the Board, a letter which Overseer of the Poor Thomas E. Greene had received from the Public Welfare, Bureau of Investigation of the City of New York., advising that Fannie Benjamin who formerly resided in the Town of Riverhead, was in the Kings County Hospital and asking that the Town of Riverhead, pay the hospital bill.

On motion and vote the Board recommended and authorized Overseer of the Poor Thomas E. Greene, to obtain an opinion as to the position of the Town in regard to paying hospital bill for Fannie Benjamin, who is in the Kings County Hospital.

Justice Penny reported that the committee consisting of Town Superintendent Charles O. Downs and Justice Penny had consulted County Engineer A. O. Smith as directed by the Town Board, in regard to the corner of East Jamesport Lane and Main Road at Jamesport and had decided to ease this turn without damage to the property of Percy I. Bergen.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved that the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to borrow upon promissory note the sum of Thirty Two Hundred Fifty Six and 89/100 Dollars to pay on account of audited bills of June 28, 1927

On motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Monday, July 11, 1927 at 2 P.M.
