

Minutes of the meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Clerk's Office, Monday, September 12, 1927 at 2 P. M.

The meeting was called to order by the Supervisor who thereupon opened the proposals received up to the time of the opening of the meeting for the sale of Town Bonds in the amount of \$17,000.00, to pay the share of the said town of the cost of construction and improvement of the Coram-Middle Island East County Federal Aid Highway, Project #448, in the presence of all the members of the Board and representatives of various bidders.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the foregoing bids were received and placed on file.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, it was RESOLVED that the bid of the L.I. State Bank & Trust Co. of Riverhead, N.Y. of \$102.67, be and the same is hereby declared to be the highest bid, and be it further RESOLVED that the said bid of the L.I. State Bank & Trust Co., of Riverhead, N.Y., of \$102.67, be and the same is hereby accepted and the entire issue of the Town Highway Bonds, Series of 1927, in the amount of \$17,000.00 be and the same is hereby awarded to the L.I. State Bank & Trust Co., and be it further

RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and hereby is

authorized and directed to proceed with the preparation, execution and delivery of said bonds in accordance with all former resolutions of this Board and the resolution or act of the Supervisors of Suffolk County in relation to the issuance of said Bonds and to deliver said bonds to the purchaser upon the receipt of the full amount due at the time of such delivery.

WHEREAS, it appears that the Darlington Realty & Surety Co., were the owners of the tract of land situated at Calverton, in the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk and State of New York, known as Darlington Manor, and

WHEREAS, the said Darlington Realty & Surety Co., caused to have made a survey of the said premises and divided the premises into certain lots and constructed and designated on said Map certain streets, one of said streets is known as Connecticut Avenue, which as shown on said Map runs from Peconic River Northerly to River Road, and

WHEREAS, the said Map was duly filed in the Office of the Clerk of the County of Suffolk on May 28, 1908, and known and designated as Map # 338, and

WHEREAS, the said Connecticut Avenue has never been formally adopted and accepted as such public street or highway,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the said Connecticut Avenue, as shown on said Map and more particularly bounded and described as follows:- BEGINNING at a point in the Southerly margin of River Street or River Road leading from Calverton to Manorville, thence running South no degrees twenty-two minutes thirty seconds East ( S.  $0^{\circ}$ -22'-30" E.) thirteen hundred twenty-five (1325) feet; thence running South two degrees sixteen minutes twenty seconds West ( S  $2^{\circ}$  -16'-20" W.) two hundred (200) feet to the main Stream of Peconic River.

The above described line to be the centre line of

the highway fifty (50) feet in width passing through Darlington Manor and land of DeLancey Nicoll, Jr., as shown on map of Survey made September 10, 1927, by A. S. Havens, Surveyor of Centre Moriches, N.Y. and filed herewith.

The above described highway being and intended to be the same as Connecticut Avenue, shown on a certain Map entitled Darlington Manor and filed in Suffolk County Clerk's office as Map No. 338, and as shown on the attached survey, be and is hereby accepted, received, dedicated and adopted and hereby and hereafter known as Connecticut Avenue and is a public road or highway of the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk and State of New York, and the rest of Connecticut Avenue is hereby accepted as shown on Map of Darlington Manor, filed in Suffolk County Clerk's office as Map #338, and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent of Highways make an order designating the said Connecticut Avenue as a public road in the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk and State of New York, and cause said order to be duly recorded in the Highway records in the Town of Riverhead, County and State aforesaid.

Almon G. Rasquin addressed the Board relative to the Water Commissioners of the Riverhead Water District. No action was taken on this matter, it being agreed to make this the order of business for the next meeting of the Town Board.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned to meet on September 28, 1927 at 2 P. M.
