

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, January 21, 1948 at 2:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on January 14, 1948 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Notice of Public Hearing upon the application of the Rite-Way Bus Company to operate a motor bus line on and along certain highways in the Town of Riverhead was read.

Proof of publication of the above notice was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Kelly thereupon declared the hearing open and anyone who wished could be heard at that time.

Mr. Solomon Raffé, Attorney, appeared before the Board in favor of the application.

There being no one else wishing to be heard, the hearing was declared closed.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that pursuant to the provisions of Section 66 of the Transportation Corporations Law of the State of New York as amended, the request of the Rite-Way Bus Company for consent to operate a Motor Bus Line in the Town of Riverhead along Route 25 from the intersection of Peconic Avenue to the westerly boundary line of the Town of Riverhead be and the same is hereby granted for a period of five years beginning on the 21st day of January, 1948 to the 20th day of January, 1953, however, in the event that the said bus company is unable to acquire the consents to operate in municipalities between the Town of Riverhead and the City of New York, this consent terminates one year from this date. The Vote, Justice Zaleski absent, Justices Warner, Yousik and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 4, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Mr. Jensen of the Dual Parking Meter Company explained in detail the workings of the "Dual Parking Meter" and the agreement that the Company would offer to the Town of Riverhead, should the Board except this meter.

A notice was read from the New York State Public Service Commission advising the Board that a hearing will be held in the office of the Commission, 233 Broadway, New York City on the matter of the increased rates proposed by Robert R. Brown of the Sunrise Coach Lines. The Notice was ordered placed on file.

A request, signed by several taxpayers of the Town of Riverhead, for a street light on Pole #7, Newton Avenue was presented to the Board and on motion and vote was referred to the Lighting District Committee.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes submitted a report of the amount of taxes collected as of January 16, 1948 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.


On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the owners of the property of the Roanoke-Griffing Avenue Parking Field be offered the same rental as last year. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board. Justice Zaleski was present.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the Supervisor be authorized to transfer the sum of \$500.00 from the General Town Account to the Riverhead Town Planning Board Account. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, go on record of favoring the proposed Airport to be operated adjacent to the Town of Riverhead, feeling that this proposed Airport would be of great benefit to the growth and prosperity of the Town of Riverhead. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town and highway machinery bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, January 28, 1948 at 2:00 P.M.
