

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on September 10, 1931 at 2 P.M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting of August 26, 1931 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A communication received from Leroy Graff, was read, requesting that the curb and gutter on Griffing Avenue in front of his store be improved. Communication was called to the attention of the Superintendent of Highways and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the County Treasurer relative to tax collections in the Town was read and referred to the Supervisor.

A communication received from Mrs. George C. Miller was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication received from Mrs. Edna H. Gosman, was read expressing appreciation for the manner in which Special Constable Heatley carried on his duties at the Wading River Beach. Communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication from Mrs. B.C. Meyer of Northville Turnpike, requesting that a committee investigate the placing of lighting company poles in front of her property, was read and referred to the Highway Committee for investigation.

A communication from the New York State Commission for the celebration of the Town/Hundredth Anniversary of the birth of George Washington in the year 1932 was read and held over for consideration of the Board at a later meeting.

A renewal of the street lighting contract between the

Long Island Lighting Company and the towns of Brookhaven and Riverhead, for the Wading River Lighting District was presented and Justice Miller was requested to ascertain if said contract called for the number of lights in the district.

Justice Burnside advised the Board that he had received requests that a special constable be stationed at Jamesport near the school to protect the children going to and from school. Justice Frederick was requested to investigate this matter.

Mr. Lafayette Hand requested that a committee of the town board inspect the curb and gutters at the abutment of Northville Turnpike with Roanoke Avenue, advising that the condition was not satisfactory since the new concrete highway had been constructed. The highway committee was requested to investigate this condition.

Mr. George E. Luce addressed the Board and advised that the Town Board should take some action to make it necessary for peddlers and people selling goods in the town from trucks be required to pay a fee for the privilege.

Mr. Julian Rubenstein representing the American Legion requested that additional space be filled in at the Legion Parking space so that additional automobiles might be parked in this space and thereby leaving additional parking space on the streets in the business section. This matter was referred to the Superintendent of Highways.

Justice Frederick advised that property owners at Jamesport were considering dedicating land for the laying out of a highway now known as Sixth Street. The highway committee was requested to investigate this matter.

Justice Conklin advised that the Civic Club of Riverhead had requested that the Town authorize the painting of the mile stones throughout the Town. Supervisor Homan suggested that he be authorized to request the Board of Supervisors to have mile stones throughout the County restored and painted.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was

Resolved That Supervisor Homan be and he hereby is authorized and directed to request the Board of Supervisors of Suffolk County to have mile stones throughout the County restored and repainted.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet September 30, 1931 at 2 P.M.
