

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Clerk's Office, Saturday September 28th, 1912 at 2:00 P. M.

Mr. Frank W. Conn, representing the New York Telephone Company appeared before the Board and requested that permission be granted the Telephone Company to open Main Street in the Village of Riverhead for the purpose of placing and maintaining subway and cable, with the necessary manholes and branches to poles, and buildings, as follows, and shown on blue print attached;

Build four (4) duct tile subway on north side of Main Street opposite Central Office to Roanoke Avenue, approximately 365 feet.

Build manholes opposite Central Office, and at Roanoke Avenue.

Branch from manhole opposite Central Office to pole #2177 on south side of Main Street, west of Griffing Avenue, approximately 375 feet.

Branch from manhole opposite Central Office to pole R20 on west side of Griffing Avenue north of Main Street approximately 285 feet.

Branch from manhole opposite Central Office to Central Office building approximately 30 feet.

From manhole at Roanoke Avenue to cellar of building on northwest corner of Roanoke Avenue and Main Street, approximately 20 feet.

From manhole at Roanoke Avenue to cellar of building on northeast corner of Roanoke Avenue and Main Street, approximately 85 feet.

From manhole at Roanoke Avenue to pole #277 on east side of Roanoke Avenue, approximately 170 feet

From manhole at Roanoke Avenue to pole R57 on south side of Main Street east of Bridge Street, approximately 255 ft.

From manhole at Roanoke Avenue to pole #874 on west side of Bridge Street south of Main Street, approximately 255 feet.

Manhole to be placed in middle of Street, Roanoke Avenue at Main Street, so that vehicles may pass either side of Manhole.

It being understood and agreed that the work shall be done in such a manner as to not interfere with public travel, and the streets promptly restored to their original

condition, and it is further understood and agreed, that, the New York Telephone Company will save the Town of Riverhead harmless from any, and all claims for damages from accident or otherwise by reason of said excavation work.

On motion the above application was granted.


A petition was presented asking for an electric light at the corner of Maple Avenue and New Road in the Village of Riverhead and on motion the above petition was granted.

A petition was presented to the Town Board requesting the extension of the present lighting district in the Village of Riverhead as follows:

Commencing on Main Street at the termination of the present lighting district near the corner of property owned by Frank G. Yetter extending thence Westerly along said Main Street to the southwest corner of property owned by George Pugsley.

On motion it was ordered that no action be taken on above petition until an opinion had been obtained from the Town Attorney as to what authority the Town Board had relative to same.

There being no further business, meeting adjourned.
