

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, December 10, 1930 at 2 P.M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held November 26, 1930 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

The lighting committee reporting on petition for light on East Main Street and requests for other lights within the Riverhead Lighting District recommended as follows:

Install one 600 candle power bracket lamp on pole No. 8 on the south side of East Main Street.

Install one 600 candle power bracket lamp on the fork of Main and Court Streets and eliminate the 80 candle power lamp on the southerly side of Main Street at this junction.

Install two poles on the easterly side of Ostrander Avenue between Corwin Street and the Railroad crossing and install one 80 candle power lamp on the southerly pole.

Install another pole on the easterly side of Osborn Avenue directly north of the Railroad crossing and place one 600 candle power bracket lamp on this pole, eliminating the 80 candle power lamp now on the second pole south of Lincoln Street.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved that the recommendations of the Lighting Committee be accepted and that the Long Island Lighting Company be requested to make the following installations and changes:

Install one 600 candle power bracket lamp on pole No. 8 on the south side of East Main Street.

Install one 600 candle power bracket lamp on the fork of Main and Court Streets and eliminate the 80 candle power lamp on the southerly side of Main Street at this junction.

Install two poles on the easterly side of Ostrander Avenue between Corwin Street and the Railroad crossing and install one 80 candle power lamp on the southerly pole.

Install a pole on the easterly side of Osborn Avenue directly north of the Railroad crossing and place one 600 candle power bracket lamp on this pole, eliminating the 80 candle power lamp now on the second pole south of Lincoln Street.

Supervisor Homan appointed Justice Miller and Justice Frederick a committee to check the petition calling for an election to vote on the proposition of creating a police district and ascertain if said petition contains the necessary signatures.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes presented Burglary and Interior Holdup policies of the Century Indemnity Company insuring him against losses which might arise under these conditions.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the burglary and interior hold up policies of the Century Indemnity Company be accepted and that said policies be cancelled at the end of two months when they will no longer be needed.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor be requested to designate Northville Turnpike as the highway on which the State monies for the laying of concrete be spent.

Julian Rubenstein, Chairman of the Civic Welfare Committee of the American Legion, addressed the Board and advised that the local post of the American Legion had received permission from the Beehive Store of Patchogue to use its property directly east of the business section on the south side of East Main Street for parking purposes and requested that the Town take steps to have the property placed in a suitable condition for parking purposes.

Supervisor Homan referred the matter to Town Superintendent of Highways Charles O. Downs, to work in conjunction with Mr. Rubenstein and look the property over and advise

the Board the cost of making the necessary improvements.

Julian Rubenstein, Clerk of the Supervisor requested that the Town purchase another adding Machine and desk lamps for the town offices.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized to purchase an adding machine, desk lamps and necessary office equipment.

It was decided to hold the next meeting of the Town Board on the 24th day of December in place of the last Wednesday of December.

There being no further business, on motion and vote the meeting adjourned.
